### "Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world" Nelson Mandela 1918-2013

If you know me, you'll know that I'm passionate about children's education, not only because of my background in the teaching profession, but also because every child has a right to learn and to grow within their culture to work towards a better future. How often do we stop and think how fortunate we are that our children or grandchildren, irrespective of gender, are entitled to a full-time education within a safe and structured setting from the term in which they are five? This is

something we expect as a fundamental human right and take for granted. True, we might complain about yet another change in the curriculum, or the school is closed for an Inset Day, but do we ever give thanks that the education is there for our children? What if it wasn't? We would rightly make a loud and long protest over it, demanding the rights for our children.

But today, there are 57 million girls and boys around the world who are denied the right to education - the struggle for education remains a matter of life and death for millions of children. The world was, and is, astounded by the kidnapping of more than 270 girls from a school in northern Nigeria. Last year, 'A World at School', in partnership with the Office of the UN Special Envoy for Global Education, brought together over 100 NGOs and hundreds of youth in solidarity with the brave education campaigner Malala Yousafzai for "Malala Day." The UN subsequently adopted a powerful Youth Resolution calling on world leaders to deliver on the promise of education for all.

With time running out until the end of 2015, progress has stalled on the task outlined in the UN Millennium Development Goal (MDG2) to get all children into school and learning. With the number of out-ofschool children on the rise, 'A World at School', an international organisation, is magnifying the efforts of all organisations working to get all children into school and learning. Check out the world map here <u>http://</u><u>www.aworldatschool.org/the-crisis-map</u> which shows, country by country, the number of primary aged children who are out of school.

In areas where families have to flee violence, war and oppression, Save the Children and the Norwegian Refugee Council asked opinions of those affected regarding emergency response. The result was a resounding call for education to be prioritised as a core part of emergency response. Education is not only a fundamental human right, but the most effective way to alleviate poverty. The world cannot afford the repercussions of failing to educate future generations. Education is an entitlement for all young people – and a sound investment, too.

One child's response: "With education I think I will have a future that won't have to involve guns and fighting. This is my dream that I can look into my future and see that I have options and choices. Without school you have no choices in life, you are just trying to survive." – 13-year-old boy, Democratic Republic of Congo

We can all do a little to help provide education for children around the world and if we all do a little it becomes a lot! The CRoFTT Benefice is having a Michaelmas Fayre on September 27<sup>th</sup> with 50% of the proceeds going to 'Save the Children' for their work in providing education for the 1 million plus Syrian refugee children\*. Maybe you could donate something for a stall and/or come along to support the cause? Look out for further details nearer the time!

Visiting is part of the Church's Ministry. If you would like a visit from someone from the church, please call the Benefice Office and we will do our best to arrange it.

If you are going into or in hospital... You can help to make sure that the church team can respond as you would like us to when you are ill. It's important that if you are admitted to hospital, you do three things:-

- 1. Make sure someone tells one of the ministry team that you are going into hospital - ask them to pass on the message as appropriate.
- 2. Make it plain to the hospital staff whether (or not!) you would like a visit. This means that when someone rings up, they won't have to spend time saying 'hang on, 'I'll just ask him/her...'
- 3. Make it plain what sort of visit you would like: would you prefer a friend from the church or one of the visiting team or would you particularly like a clergy visit? If you want to be certain of a private, one to one chat, don't be afraid to ask the hospital staff if they will allow your minister to come outside normal visiting hours, so that they don't take up precious time and space from your family.

### LORDS OF TYTHERINGTON MANOR

In 1728 the Manor of Tytherington was sold by the Willoughby de Broke family to Peter Hardwicke a doctor from Bristol. The Manor remained for many generations in the hands of the Hardwicke family until 26th December 1935 when Hardwicke Lloyd Hardwicke died and the estate was put up for sale. Yes his first name and surname were the same!! The Hardwicke Estate was broken up in December 1936 and sold off. Amongst many properties which went under the hammer Tower Hill Farm sold for £1.000. Edwards Farm £350. and Yew Tree Farm £1,335.

### Computer repairs were a computer rip off

South Gloucestershire Council Trading Standards would like to remind residents to be cautious when choosing a trader and to ensure you know the full details of the company you choose.

This warning comes after the police received reports from elderly residents in the Bristol area who felt they had been conned by a trader they employed to mend their computers.

The residents responded to an advert in a newspaper offering computer repair services, which mentioned a discount for pensioners. The trader provided no paperwork and it is unclear what repairs he had actually undertaken. In one case he suggested it would be too costly to repair a laptop, so loaned the resident another for a fee of hundreds of pounds but had not returned the original computer. With no paperwork and only the mobile telephone number in the newspaper advert, it may prove difficult for the residents to pursue their complaints.

Earlier this month, a Somerset man was found guilty of operating a similar scam following an investigation by Devon and Somerset Trading Standards. The offender was handed a one year prison sentence, suspended for two years, by the court.

The scenario above demonstrates the need for consumers to know who they are dealing with. The following advice is offered to anyone looking to employ a tradesman:

- If you are looking for a tradesman, do your homework. Seek recommendations from friends or family or look for a business that belongs to a reputable trade association.
- Ensure you have the correct company name and/or owners name and the full postal address this will not guarantee the work is done satisfactorily but may enable you to take further action if things go wrong.
- If you enter into a contract in your home you are afforded cancellation rights by law. It is a criminal offence if the trader does not give you written details of your right to cancel.
- Make sure you ask for written details of the work agreed and what was actually done, and ask for proof of any payment you make, such as a receipt.

If you think you have fallen victim to a scam or rogue trader, please report it to Trading Standards via the Citizens Advice consumer service on 08454 04 05 06.



### Michaelmas Fayre Saturday 27th September

The Michaelmas Fayre which is taking place on 27th Sep-

tember is an event in which all 5 parishes which make up our benefice will be taking part.

The chief aim of the event is to raise money to help Syrian refugees who have fled to countries including Jordan, Lebanon, Iraq, Egypt and Bulgaria as well as raising funds for our own parish churches.

For three years, too many innocent people in Syria have suffered - above all the children of Syria.

Over one million Syrian children have fled Syria for safety and three million children remain displaced inside the country. The situation for these chil-



dren is dire. These children have lost their homes, seen their loved ones killed, their schools destroyed and their hopes eroded. They have been physically or psychologically wounded and they are vulnerable to the worst types of exploitation. They remain the most vulnerable victims in the conflict.

Children like three year old Ashraf, who was born on the day the Syria conflict began. For the first year of his life he rarely left his home, some days the bombings were relentless. Terrified, the family escaped leaving their home and everything behind - except for a few precious items. No longer afraid of bombs, Ashraf is still scared at the sound of loud bangs. It will take him and his generation many years to recover.

So if you can knit, sew, make pots, soap, wooden toys, jam, chutney, grow plants, paint pictures, or have any other talent which can make money to help Syrian refugees and our local churches, we would appreciate your support.
