Our daughter has lived in a terraced house in Easton for the last 12 years. It's a bit different from Tortworth but she loves it.



In the tiny garden is a fabulous camellia tree. It radiates pink from late November until Easter. It is as tall as the house. If it was in a National Trust garden, people would stop and take photographs. The petals turn the whole area pink when they fall and we collect sacks full and put them on our compost heap. (She's really only got room for a wormery!). It has guite a trunk and I reckon it must be about 80 years old. Now why is it there?

I like to think it was planted to commemorate the homecoming of someone from the war. A real celebration. I guess I could research and


find out who lived there at the time. I'm not sure I want to find out in case I'm wrong. How sad if it was planted because someone never did return home. To plant a tree in the devastated city of Bristol in the immediate aftermath of war, must have taken huge imagination and effort. And yet there is that tree in Easton,

dropping its petals like the poppies of Flanders, to remind us that peace is possible.

It seems unimaginable that in years to come people might be planting trees in Gaza, Ukraine, and Russia, and yet we have seen newly planted trees in Bosnia following the tragedy of the Balkan war

Over the years we have planted many, many trees; some in celebration, others to enhance our towns and villages. The Jubilees, the Coronation, gave us lots of excuses to plant significant trees. We are surrounded by trees planted by our forebears. Many have also developed where land has been left to mature or hedges left to grow.





What significant occasion will you commemorate by planting a tree? Let us hope it is for a great celebration and we pray that trees will flourish in those areas currently being devastated by conflict. A sign of life arising from ruins and conflict.





Falfield Parish Council

At the Parish Council meeting in April Councillors decided to move the Parish Council meetings from the 3rd Tuesday in the month to the 3rd Monday in the month commencing in May 2024.

After long discussion with the Council's Insurers agreement has been reached that the vandalised benches on the Village Green were covered by the Council's insurance. An order has now been placed for two 1.8m hardwood benches and it was hoped that delivery and installation would be completed within the next few weeks.

Although the Avon and Somerset Frampton and Charfield Beat Team were unable to attend the meeting, in their written report it was noted that the crime statistics for the six months up to February 2024 totalled 28 reported incidents with the highest being 'Violence against the person'. Further details of Crime stats for the Beat Team area can be found at https://www.police.uk/pu/your-area/avon-somerset-constabulary/frampton-and-charfield/?yourlocalpolicingteam=about-us&tab=crimemap. Also in their report they advised that a Neighbourhood Watch scheme had been set up covering the roads on the Linden Homes development and that their next 'Talk to Us' event would take place on Tuesday 28th May between 9am and 10am in Falfield Village Hall.

The next meeting of the Parish Council would be its Annual Parish Council Meeting on 20th May this would follow the Annual Parish meeting which would commence at 7pm. Details of the agendas for these meetings would be published on the Council's website where the minutes of previous meetings can also be found.







ARE YOU AN UNPAID CARER?

It is important for unpaid carers to be aware that they are not alone and that there is help and support out there, for many it is a role that is thrust on them when a partner or relative is no longer able to fully care for themselves.

When you are caring for someone it is worth registering with South Gloucestershire Council and requesting an assessment, this can be done by contacting the Council on 01454 860007 or the Carers Support Centre on 0117 9652200 this will give the carer the opportunity to reflect on the caring role and support that they may require for their own health and wellbeing, once the assessment is complete the Council will be in touch with the outcome and any additional support that that may be available.

Support services that are available from the Carers Support Centre are, information, advice and guidance through the carers support line, respite breaks for carers, courses and workshops, counselling and carers emergency card that ensures if you have an accident or are taken ill the person that you care for will be taken care of.

It is important that carers do not try to do everything on their own there is a multitude of services out there that can be accessed by having an assessment that will open the advice and support to help. May is Lyme Disease Awareness Month.

Lyme disease is a bacterial infection spread by Tick bites that can be dangerous.

Ticks are small bugs that can be tiny as a pin head. They burrow into the skin. May is when most people contract it, as they are getting outdoors again.

Those most at risk are children and over **50s** as they spend the most time in nature.

Here are easy things you can do to protect yourself:

- Wear lighter coloured clothes to more easily spot Ticks.
- Tuck trouser legs into socks when around long grass.
- Wear an insect repellent, found in outdoors shops or online.
- Check yourself when you get home for any rogues.
- If you have a tick engorged; remove it safely, gently pulling upwards with a tick removal tool or tweezers. Try not to squish the tick.
- If bitten, see your GP immediately. Not all ticks transmit Lyme Disease but a short course of preventative antibiotics could save you complications.
- If you weren't bitten to your knowledge, keep an eye on yourself. The bacteria is shaped like a corkscrew. These drill down into different parts of the body, so many different symptoms can present themselves.
- Sore joints, fatigue, headaches and flulike symptoms are common but not exclusive. A bullseye rash is diagnostic, but there are other variations, also not everyone gets a rash.

Doctors are only trained on acute infection, so early intervention is key.

Lyme Disease is brutal, but don't abandon the outdoors. Be aware and up your tick bite prevention game!

Run 10K for us at the Great Bristol Run on 19th May 2024 and help give local people the advice they need




