Not only do we have Bonfire Night, that is followed by Remembrance Day and the subsequent Sunday services when we welcome mem-


bers of the Royal British Legion and youth organisations to our services. Services in which we rightly recall the work and sacrifice of the armed force personnel, both in our world today as well as in the past years, with the horrors of world wars and recent bloody conflicts that took – and still take - so many young lives. Conflicts that leave men, women and children damaged physically and mentally. We will remember them.

Most of us recall throughout the year those people who have shared our lives and moved on. We have no need of a special month or special occasion to remind us – we still feel the love, we still long for the hug, the touch, the reassuring smile or even the questioning raised eyebrow. We will remember them.

As I get older I find I have a much longer list of people to recall. Some of these are people from parishes in which I have served and whose 'dates' are too numerous to recall individually – they never actually leave you – the memories still remain. In the benefice this year our villages have said farewells to many long-standing neighbours and friends. We will remember them.

As we remember people, it's not a death that we recall, it is the life of the person – the times we have laughed or discussed or argued or rejoiced or cried with them. Our diocesan vision from Bishop Rachel is about life – LIFE! ...and life in all its fullness. Our lives are to be lived and enjoyed – NOT endured. Life is such a gift – and one we take for granted unless something stops us

and makes us reflect on the enormity of the awesome and yet fragile gift you and I have been given. The acute pain of loss reminds us of the vitality of the life we are privileged to live. +Rachel's vision encourages us to look at our own lives and at the way in which we, as individuals and as a local church, are engaged in the life and lives of people around us. It is easy for churches to become inward looking and so in the benefice this year at this time of Remembrance, I will be encouraging us all to not only rightly remember the sacrifices of wars and conflicts; the loss of our own loved ones and those from our benefice, but also to give thanks for our present neighbours and colleagues – whom let's face it, we sometimes take for granted too! We will remember them.



....and don't let's forget that, as Christians, our lives are built on the sacrifice of a young man who willingly gave up His life in order that we can truly live. Will you remember Him?

Who are the chaplains?

We seem to have been a part of the CRoFTT benefice now for quite some time helping out with various services alongside other clergy, but it is only in the past weeks that Rev Canon Frances Wookey and I have officially become chaplains to the benefice. SO.... who are we??

Well Frances first... I spent the first half of my working life in the business world and am an Associate of the Chartered Insurance Institute. However I always felt that I was rather a square peg in a round hole, and redundancy from a demanding job at Lloyd's Bank in 1992 gave me respite to listen to what God wanted me to do next. After a period of exploration and discernment, I did three years' training on the West of England Ministerial Training



Course and was ordained in Gloucester Cathedral in 1997. After a curacy in Gloucester, I became vicar of a rural benefice in Worcester Diocese which had three churches when I started and nine by the time I retired in 2015! I was Rural Dean for six years during that time; also privileged to be made an Honorary Canon of Worcester Cathedral where I still do a monthly stint as day chaplain. Since retiring, I have become involved in supporting and representing retired clergy at both local and national levels. I have been delighted always to be made so welcome in CRoFTT Benefice, and look forward to my continuing role assisting Sue, especially taking Sunday services since - contrary to popular belief! - ordination does not confer the gift of being everywhere at once. I am married to Roger and our lives are ruled by Thea, a bouncy black Labrador. I like to cook – and to eat!! I take a keen interest in politics and current affairs, and enjoy being entertained through the media of reading, theatre, music and television; I also make things ranging from cards to jumpers. I even write occasionally, so maybe I am Ernie Wise to Sue's Eric Morecambe - read on to understand the last comment wot I wrote.....



Well, now me here I go..! I'm Rev Sue ... born at a very early age, thought life was a game to be played so headed off to take on the world by going to Chelsea College of PE, Eastbourne a specialist college, where everyone else seemed to be an international in one sport or another.... but I wasn't!! I just liked playing games.....and I still do!! I taught in a number of schools before allowing God to catch me and to cut a long story short, I went to Trinity College Bristol to do a theology course leading to ordination. I was ordained deacon in 1989 in Wells Cathe-

dral and have been in full-time stipendiary ministry until I retired in 2011. I served two curacies and a short time as a Senior Assistant Priest, then had the living in two sets of parishes. First of all in Coventry diocese and the second here in Gloucester diocese. My particular interests lie in Music and Liturgy (so I did a further degree in that at Leeds Uni) and Church Schools - and yes, I did a further degree in that at Gloucester Uni. At present, just for fun I am researching clergy training for their work in CE primary schools at Bath Uni!! So, that's me...oh and by the way, I swim to keep fit and play the piano after the style of Eric Morecambe where most of the notes are there, but not necessarily in the right order! I think that's me in a nutshell.

So what is our vision for this next role within these parishes?? As chaplains Frances and I will be looking to give you guidance and advice as each parish wrestles with a variety of different challenges spiritually, liturgically and pastorally. This will be a very different style of ministry to that of a full time stipendiary priest, but we hope it will give the leadership that congregations and parishes need at this time, preparing the churches to move forward, developing strengths and the ability to embrace new goals.

Visiting

Visiting is part of the Church's Ministry. If you would like a visit from the church,

please call the Benefice Office and we
will do our best to arrange it.

If you are going into or in hospital... You can help to make sure that the church team can respond as you would like us to when you are ill.

It's important that if you are admitted to hospital, you do three things:-

- Make sure someone tells one of the ministry team that you are going into hospital – ask them to pass on the message as appropriate.
- Make it plain to the hospital staff whether (or not!) you would like a visit. This means that when someone rings up, they won't have to spend time saying 'hang on, 'I'll just ask him/her...'
- 3. Make it plain what sort of visit you would like: would you prefer a friend from the church or one of the visiting team or would you particularly like a clergy visit? If you want to be certain of a private, one to one chat, don't be afraid to ask the hospital staff if they will allow your minister to come outside normal visiting hours, so that they don't take up precious time and space from your family.





The Clock at St James', Tytherington



This rare, one-handed clock, on the south wall of the tower is sixteenth century, originally with a wooden face and probably made in Bristol or Chew Magna.

In 1947, when the bells were being re-hung, some scrap metal, which turned out to be the remains of this ancient clock, were noticed in the tower. Most of the necessary parts were there, so they were reassembled and reinstated.

The work was paid for by public subscription and in 1948 the clock was dedicated to all those from the village who gave their lives in the Second World War 1939 – 45. (A plaque at the back of the church commemorates this event.) The clock mechanism runs for fifty hours so needs rewinding on a regular basis.

The clock has recently been repainted by Ian Street of Cromhall, in memory of Bill Cornock, who had painted it on two previous occasions - once from the top of a ladder, with the Rev'd W Neighbour standing at the base!

The Cornock family would like to thank everyone who contributed to the collection after Bill's funeral, which enabled the repainting to take place and to the members of the Parochial Church Council for organising it.

FALFIELD PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

On the 17th October the Council met with six Councillors in attendance, Ward Councillor John O'Neill, the Community Liaison Officer from HMP Eastwood and five members of the public.

One major issue in which the Parish Council have been involved in recently is in regard to the lack of street lighting in Church Avenue and Eastley Close, Eastwood Park. As these are unadopted roads they do not come under the responsibility of South Gloucestershire and are under the ownership of the Ministry of Justice (MoJ). The Parish Council, on behalf of the residents, have been in contact with the MoJ requesting that this work be completed, but to date without any real success. Because of this Councillors decided to write to Luke Hall MP to inform him of the residents' concerns and the lack of response to date from the MoJ.

Councillors were also made aware that the appeal by Cotswold Homes (PT17/0770/O) for up to 115 dwellings, together with development of a 'Park and Share' facility for up to 100 cars at Heneage Farm would take place on 6th February 2018 at the Council Offices, Badminton Road, Yate and is expected to last six days.

The remainder of the meeting covered the usual items of finance, footpaths, highways and planning. The Council still has one vacancy, so if you are interested or would like further information about the Parish Council please contact the Clerk or look at the Falfield website for more information. http://www.falfield.org.uk/council.html

Information received following the meeting.

On 18th October the Parish Council received information from South Gloucestershire Planners in relation to the appeal by Cotswold Homes (PT17/0770/O) for 115 dwellings at Heneage Farm, that Cotswold Homes have now informed the Planning Inspectorate that they will reduce the number of dwellings from 115 to 85.

Cotswold Homes have <u>also</u> submitted a further outline planning application (PT17/4800/O) on the same land to provide up to 85 dwellings, together with development of a 'Park and Share' facility for up to 100 cars and new Community Hub. The closing date for comments on this application is 8th November 2017. This application is then expected to come before the Development Control (West) Committee on 14th December 2017 for determination. If the application is approved then the Cotswold Homes appeal will fall away. In the event the application is rejected the appeal will proceed as planned on 6th February 2018.

John Wilmot: The Dancing Rector of Tortworth 2

As you may have gathered from our initial encounter with Mr Wilmot, it appears that he wasn't one to hold back from having a good time.

Two witnesses are recorded as having seen the rector taking part in the Cushion Dance



one Sunday evening in December 1601 at the church house (roughly the equivalent of a church hall) in Tortworth, following a wedding.

Giles Daunt, a gentleman of Ozleworth, stated that as he and Mr Wilmot were well acquainted, Mr Wilmot had

asked if he would dance. Daunt agreed on condition that Mr Wilmot would begin and lead it. Mr Wilmot then proceeded to lead the Cushion Dance with a cushion on his shoulder; he kneeled down and kissed Goodwyfe Hickes. (The Hicks family owned property in Tortworth; Thomas Hicks was churchwarden in 1598 and William Hicks in 1619.) This evidence was supported by one William Lawrence, a husbandman living in Tortworth, who also gave evidence that the rector proceeded to kiss and dance his way around the room.

According to Giles Daunt, when asked to lead the dance, Wilmot replied, "Faith, that I will, for now the Bishop hath suspended me from preaching, I will practise and study all knaveries." William Lawrence reported having heard him say something similar.

It seems that Mr Wilmot had 'issues' with his superiors, both spiritual and temporal. Daunt went on to say that Mr Wilmot and Sir Thomas Throckmorton had been at variance for some time and another witness, Guy Poole, a Yeoman of Tortworth, stated that Sir Thomas Throckmorton and Mr Wilmot were not friends.

Perhaps this case was an attempt at character assassination as it seems to focus on calling Mr Wilmot's morality into question. Witnesses, most of whom depended on Sir Thomas Throckmorton for their income, homes, or both were brought to attest to Mr Wilmot's claim to be able to concoct recipes for making it easy to catch rabbits or deer as well as ways to win at gaming, charms to ensure women could obtain a husband and ways of ensuring prosperity in general.

Evidence of this was given by William Throckmorton, son of Sir Thomas, who claimed that Mr Wilmot had told him that he could make a recipe which, with corn or grain etc and given to deer to eat, would make them fall asleep so that they could be easily caught. Mr Wilmot had also told him that he could tell him a way to win at gaming. Moreover, he had shown him a book containing details of the course of the planets and how this could be used to ensure prosperity. This book also contained details enabling a man to make any woman lie with him and of curses and charms which could ensure success at dice and gaming tables.
