The Council has set its budget for 2018/19 and is pleased to announce that there will be no increase in the parish precept.

In other news, the council has responded to the latest Joint Spatial Plan and intends to comment on the new National Policy Statement (NPS) relating to the development of nuclear new build power stations (NNB) and consultation on South Gloucestershire Climate Change strategy.

Grants have been awarded to various local groups including Cromhall Flower show committee, PTFA St Andrews school, <u>T@3</u>, Cromhall Village Hall committee, Tortworth Forest Centre, St Peters Hospice, Benefice Newsletter and Citizens Advice South Gloucestershire.

Over the coming months the Council will continue to work with South Gloucestershire Council to progress the installation of roadside entry gates to the village as part of traffic calming measures. The council also hopes to arrange for a representative from Leyhill prison to attend a council meeting.

Important notice on bus disruption:

During the Cowship Lane road closure, 12-16 February 2018 in Cromhall, the preferred option for the 84/85 buses is to go through Wickwar, along The Downs, turn left onto the B4058 until the Bibstone Turn/Tortworth Road and then continue on the usual route and vice versa. School buses are not affected as this is half term.

This will mean that Cromhall will not be served from Cowship Lane to the Bibstone Turn during this period.
