2	DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST in any items on agenda: None	
3	ADOPTION of the MINUTES: of meeting on 15 th July 2015. It was proposed by Mr M Line and seconded by Mr K White and agreed that the minutes of meeting held 15 th July 2015 be signed as a true record.	
4	TO CO-OPT MR S ASTON TO COUNCIL – AND RECEIVE DECLARATION OF ACCEPTANCE OF OFFICE	
	It was unanimously agreed to co-opt Mr Steve Aston to the council and clerk witnessed the signing of Declaration of Acceptance of Office.	
5	PUBLIC PARTICIPATION: Sadly – at the last minute rep from S Glos Council and BT had to cancel their attendance at meetingwhere they were to talk about the Super-Fast Broadband Project, however, it was	
	agreed to have discussion regarding what the situation was currently like and Clerk and Ward Member John O'Neill were assured that they would be in attendance in October.	
	Broadband Issues :- • Resident from Abbotside part of the village was present and stated that broadband	
	speeds up there are generally 0.4mb and tonight – there is no broadband at all. They get exasperated with continually calling BT and nothing being done. Their business –	
	Farming – is generally all done online these days and this situation is making life hard. They don't see why one should be penalised for choosing to live in rural communitiesparticularly when some countries abroad are so much better served,	
	and they were disappointed that there was no representation at meeting this evening.	
	 Ward member explained that it was due to illness, and couldn't be help. The team at SGC is down to 2 staff members now - and the other member really didn't have the experience to cover. Both Ward Member and Clerk had asked if BT could still attend - 	
	but Martyn Lloyd didn't feel he could as he knew that he wouldn't be able to answer a lot of the questions without Rhiannon.	
	 Other comments made were that residents / members of public felt left in the dark – that there was so much uncertainty and lack of visibility of plans 	
	They feel that the BDUK project was meant to bring broadband to the rural communities and at the moment – due to 'Value for Money' this hasn't happened as they have looked to appear to the project that the project t	
	to see where they can get the greatest benefit.	
	 The question was asked as to what Cromhall's chances were of being part of Phase 2 – when was this likely to be announced?? 	

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	 It is hoped that when RW and BT attend in October – they may have more answers. Residents wanted to know what the definition of Phase 2 was – what did this mean for them?? Will all houses in area actually get a minimum of 2mb?? The discussion then went on to what should the villages back up plan be if Phase 2 either didn't come to fruition or didn't work??? The suggestion of joining forces with other parishes wasn't very favourable, suggestion of grants via HMRC wasn't going to work as that was for businesses and not residential. Ward Member said Parish just needs to continue making a strong business case – focusing on Education / Children / local business needs, etcand keep pushing. 	 Other Issues brought to the attention of Parish Council following broadband discussion: State of Bus Shelters up at Leyhill(comment from PC was that they didn't think they were their responsibility as when inventory had been carried out few years ago – they weren't on PC's asset register)Ward Member will speak to Integrated Transport at SGC. 	 Query on replacement tree for Children's Play Area (clerk confirmed that a few meetings ago it had been agreed to replace with a silver birch – PC to pay). Whilst on play area – issue with the sliding bolt on gate – residents don't feel safe – Clerk to look into. 	TJ
	 Had there been any comeback on who owned wall by allotment gardens at back of G Cornocks Cottage??? (clerk to chase estate – as felt it was their responsibility). 	Clerk
	 Damage to drain covers x 2 – one by bungalows that Merlin look after and one by Perry's house was reported. 	Clerk
	 Issues with smells from the sewer by Green Line tanks were also mentioned. Query about who was responsible for the Church Yard – Mr Hobbs stated that this was PCC. 	
	 Query about state of roads and potholesfirst point of contact is streetcare and all potholes are reported. 	
	 It was noted that issue of Dogs on Bennetts land seemed a lot better – but it was still felt that an article in 5 Alive in next few months wouldn't go a miss – reminding people to keep dogs on leads and to keep to the footpath and always shut gates. Final item that was discussed – that Clerk / Ward Member were going to mention during Matters Arising – was the footpath from Drews Orchard to ChapelJohn O'Neill had received costings for this – and Parish Council were aghast at how much such a small stretch of footpath would cost - £78k. This is for all the work – all inbut even so it was felt that the job was over priced. Discussion went to fact that developers should have been asked to contribute – but obviously that is too late now. There is no funding left in NHB (New Homes Bonus). As such Clerk is to try and get some quotes as to how much this would cost and where they would be sitedThey are also going to look into speed reduction between Hammerly Junction and the village – so that it is $40 - 30$ and not $50 - 30$.
