Normal or what?

As I write, the spring bulbs are beginning to show the cheerful colours of Spring; all these colours are a very important part of my life, they raise my spirits, but I understand that is not everyone's experience. I can spend hours mixing water colours and never fail to be amazed at the surprising results. No doubt some of you think this a boring way to spend an afternoon, but that is why we are all unique. I recall a senior buyer of rainwear in a large department store who was totally colour blind, only seeing greys. When on buying trips, my sister had to accompany him to whisper what colour the item was, as he never let on to others about his problem. He became the Managing Director!

My late husband was red/green colour blind and would have been rejected for the armed services, but it didn't impact on his daily life, apart maybe from his bizarre choice of ties which some may remember, but he never had the thrill of the sudden colour of a tree in Autumn. When I was at art college it emerged that just over half a class of thirty suffered from some degree of numerical or word dyslexia and used art as an outlet for their frustrations and I am sure it influenced their artistic language. So many people privately grapple with these problems and find ways of disguising them every day of their lives. How many others have hidden life problems we don't know about?

I have been watching the TV programmes about autism with Chris Packham, having often thought he was an 'odd bod', which I put down to his all-consuming interest in wildlife. I now feel quite ashamed of my instant antipathy, without any knowledge of how incredible he is to be able to communicate his enthusiasm in many interesting programmes while suffering from quite severe hidden autism. The very brave personal stories of the contributors to the series showed great courage sharing how their lives are impacted by various forms of autism. Ultimately, most frightening for them was how 'normal' people react and don't understand the different way their brains work, which leads to misreading their sometimes-strange habits. It was amazing how they all found ways to hide their problems and fears; they simply didn't trust the reactions of the world, and indeed sometimes even their own families, if they shared their problems.

It is easy to blame the parent when we see a child having a meltdown in a supermarket. But take a step back, that child may suffering from autism and may be completely terrified by the noise, lights or people around them; the only way they can show their distress is to lie on the floor and scream. Yes, they may be trying it on because they cannot have sweets, but I will try hard not to judge and to have sympathy with that child who may be unable to cope with their surroundings and has some type of autism.

Watching the Packham programmes has been revealing, seeing someone's problems through their eyes is a salutary lesson. Everyone, as they mature, works out their individual ways to live

their lives but throwing into the mix the extra uncontrollable thoughts autistic folk hear in their heads results in something else. They often simply withdraw and hide from strangers, particularly avoiding eye contact. The different way their minds work, which does not fit with our normal understanding, leads to our very often thoughtless and judgemental treatment of anyone a bit different and leads to their understandable fears.

Now one question: What is 'normal'?

I would suggest there is no such thing but I leave you to ponder......

This is a situation that cannot continue as inflation and increases in housing in the Benefice will only exacerbate the problem. I have discussed this matter with my colleagues who run the production and distribution of the magazine.

We have reluctantly decided to increase our charges for advertising by 5% from April to help offset any potential increase in our outgoings. I hope our advertisers understand the reason for the increase.*



INTRODUCTION OF VOTER ID IN MAY 2023

The UK Government has introduced a requirement for voters to show photo ID when voting at a polling station at some elections. This new requirement will apply for the first time in England at the local elections on Thursday 4 May 2023.

Methods of ID you can use: You may already have a form of photo ID that is acceptable. You can use any of the following:

- Passport
- Driving licence (including provisional licence)
- Blue badge
- Certain concessionary travel cards
- Identity card with PASS mark (Proof of Age Standards Scheme)
- Biometric Immigration document
- Defence identity card
- Certain national identity cards

For more information on which forms of photo ID will be accepted, visit electoralcommission.org.uk/voterID or call their helpline on 0800 328 0280.

If you do not have an accepted form of photo ID If you don't already have an accepted form of photo ID, or you're not sure whether your photo ID still looks like you, you can apply for a free voter ID document, known as a Voter Authority Certificate. You can apply for this at voter-authority-certificate.service.gov.uk.

Alternatively, you can complete a paper application form and send this to the electoral services team at your local council.

If you need any help with applying for a Voter Authority Certificate or want to request an application form, contact your local council. To find their contact details visit electoralcommission.org.uk/voter.

This extract from 'We Grew Up in Falfield' details the programme for the celebration of King George VIth's coronation in 1937. There were evidently two sittings for the adult tea, as there has been added in pencil '& 6pm'. Clearly it was a marathon celebration lasting from 9.30am until 2.00am and no doubt there were some sore heads the next day.

(My father was a footman at Tortworth Court at the time and must have taken the opportunity of some time off to join in the celebrations in Falfield. He fell off his bicycle on his return to the Court via the back drive and got gravel rash on his face, which meant he couldn't serve in the dining room until it healed. My mother was still reminding him of this many years later!)

From Councillor John O'Neill

Update on local transport situations

Planning consent has been approved for a re-opened railway station at Charfield; the project now moves to the detailed design stage that will contribute to the full business case that will then be presented to the West of England Combined Authority for funding before moving to the construction stage.

Responsibility for supported bus services was transferred to the West of England Combined Authority in 2020 with the constituent authorities contributing to the funding, bus services have been in trouble since the pandemic that resulted in lower usage and a shortage of bus drivers, this and other factors such as fuel cost and inflation pushed up the cost of subsidies by 110% that subsequently resulted in supported services being cut, for the Five Alive area this will see the loss of the 84/85 that has not be contracted, SGC has supplied additional funding to extend the service till the 3rd June, inevitably this service will now move to the Direct Response Transport model a form of dial a ride minibus service. We have campaigned to retain the service particularly as DRT will not operate outside the South Gloucestershire area, we have managed to gain a concession for the service to operate to KLB school and continue to press for further concessions to enable the service to operate to Wotton.

National Highways once again requested SGC to defer any decision on the speculative major developments at Charfield until a mitigation strategy for junction 14 is reached on capacity issues; despite this, a planning appeal at Thornbury for 595 homes was allowed by the Planning Inspectorate. It was decided that the major issue for Thornbury traffic at junction 14 was exiting the motorway; to mitigate this issue an agreement was reached with National Highways, the developer and the planning inspector. That scheme will see the northbound slip road extended by 250 metres on the motorway to prevent traffic queuing on the motorway, there will also be improvements to the A38 to help with the flow of traffic.

The underfunding of road maintenance has seen roads deteriorate in the rural area we are doing everything we can to get some priority on the rural network.

Thornbury Heritage Trail

Thornbury is currently undergoing many changes that will shape its future but its rich and interesting heritage will never change. With Spring approaching and the weather improving, maybe now is an ideal time to have a stroll around the town and find out or remind yourself about the history of Thornbury?


The Thornbury Heritage Trail was created by Thornbury & District Heritage Trust (which runs the museum) to celebrate the Millennium in 2000. It covers a total distance of 3.7 Km (or 2½ miles) and is an enjoyable way of discovering the previous importance of the town and its history. A **recently updated guidebook** to the Trail can be bought from the Museum or from Horders on the High Street for just £2.

If you prefer a digital version, you can download the Guide (a 28-page booklet) and print an enlarged map for free from https://www.thornburymuseum.org.uk/our-area/thornbury/town-trail/ Enjoy an afternoon stroll in the sun and discover some local history as you go!

Starting at the Town Hall, you can follow the Trail's bronze way-markers, set into the pavements, and, by consulting the Trail Guide, you can bring the history of local buildings and places to life. Along the Trail, there are also seven illustrated information boards which tell you more about that particular location.

Once you reach St Mary's Church, you can enjoy the countryside section of the Trail - rural footpaths with Trail marker posts highlighting points of interest along the way - before you return to the town's footpaths.

Be aware that the rural section has some stiles and it may be muddy at times but it is well worth the effort. If you are unable to go along the rural path, it is easy to retrace your steps back to the town and then follow the remaining waymarkers to complete the Trail.



Please also take the time, now or on another occasion, to visit Thornbury & District Museum in Chapel Street. Check out our website https://www.thornburymuseum.org.uk/ for opening times, current exhibitions and much more. We look forward to welcoming you.

Falfield Parish Council Report

The February meeting had its full complement of Councillors in attendance along with our Ward Councillor, John O'Neill and ten Parishioners. The main item on the agenda for discussion was the planning application submitted by the Ministry of Justice for the expansion of HMP Eastwood Park which included a proposal to build three Open Blocks with a capacity for a total of 75 prisoners. Following concerns raised by Parishioners at the meeting Councillors unanimously agreed to object to the planning application on a number of grounds. These included that the design of the proposed block was not in keeping with its rural environment, the loss of wildlife habitat, loss of green buffer space between existing prison and residential properties and the increased traffic along Church Avenue to the prison which would result from this expansion.

Councillors noted that StreetCare Maintenance Team were planning to undertake some work in the Village during March in clearing pavements and cutting back hedges.

The next Council meeting will take place on **Tuesday 18th April at 7.30 pm in the Village Hall**. This will be the last meeting before Town, Parish and District elections take place on Thursday 4th May 2023.
