


St. Andrew's Church, Cromhall Easter Flower Festival



Falfield Parish Council Report

At their March meeting Councillors discussed the Local Plan Consultation and agreed to submit comments on behalf of the Council. Details of these comments can be found on the Parish Council website. Anyone wishing to comment on this consultation has until 11th April when it closes.

It was noted that the abandoned vehicle in Orchard View, which the Council had reported back in January, had a notice posted on its windscreen requiring the owner to remove the vehicle within 7 days. If after 7 days there was no response from the owner South Gloucestershire Council will make arrangements for the vehicle to be disposed of.

The Council is still trying to obtain accurate information from South Gloucestershire on the proposals for the northbound bus stop and shelter adj. to the War Memorial to be relocated closer to the Village Hall. This is to allow improvements to the northbound carriageway of the A38 which was a requirement of the Planning Inspector's approval following the appeal for the large housing development at West Park Farm Thornbury.

The issue of recent accidents at the junction of the A38 and the Old Gloucester Road were again discussed. Following their February meeting the Council had written to South Gloucestershire Council regarding the safety concerns at this junction and to request an update on the proposed reduction in the speed limit on the Old Gloucester Road to 40 mph. The Clerk reported that no response from South Gloucestershire Council had been received prior to this meeting.

The Parish Council currently have two Councillor vacancies of its total allowance of seven. For anyone who may be interested in becoming a Parish Councillor more information can be found on the Council's website home page.

Meetings are normally held on the third Monday in the month but as the third Monday in April is Easter Monday the meeting will be rescheduled. At the time of producing this report no fixed date has been arranged but again this date will be published on the Council's website.


The Armstrong

Thanks to the collaboration between the Armstrong Hall Trust and Thornbury Community and Arts, the former Armstrong Hall Complex, now renamed The Armstrong, is set to become a revitalised and dynamic venue for the community. 

Car parking charges in South Glos

Soon there will charges in certain South Glos car parks. Several smaller car parks and Park and Ride facilities will remain free. In addition, all short stay car parks will have a number of spaces providing free parking for up to 30 minutes. These will be clearly designated with signs and markings on the ground.

The car parks affected by this in Thornbury are:

Castle Court short and long stay car park, BS35 2BQ Rock Street short and long stay car park, BS35 2FH St Mary Street short stay car park, BS35 2AT

Short stay tariffs

- The maximum time for parking in any short stay car park will be up to 4 hours.
- The following charges will apply Monday to Saturday 8am to 6pm (excluding bank holidays):
- Up to 30 minutes free (only in specific spaces); Up to 1 hour 70p; Up to 2 hours £1.30; Up to 3 hours – £3; Up to 4 hours – £5
- No return within 4 hours.
- You can only use one of the 30 minute free parking spaces in any 12 hour period.

Long stay tariffs

The following charges will apply Monday to Saturday 8am to 6pm (excluding bank holidays):

Up to 4 hours – £3; Up to 6 hours – £4; Over 6 hours – £5; 1 Week – £20

You will be able to buy a season ticket for long stay car parks via the MiPermit website or app, subject to availability. 1 Month - £75; 6 months - £435; 1 Year - £840

Blue Badge holders: Short and long stay car parks will be free for up to 4 hours for valid Blue Badge holders.

For stays over 4 hours in a long stay the following reduced charges will apply: Up to 6 hours – £1.00; Over 6 hours – £2.00; 1 Week – £8.00

You can park in any space but you must correctly display your valid Blue Badge and time clock.

Electric vehicles: If you use an electric vehicle charging bay in any of the car parks where parking charges are being introduced you will need to pay for parking as well.

Motorcycles: Motorcycle parking will continue to be free in designated motorcycle parking bays only. Motorcycles parked in standard bays will need to pay the standard parking charge.

You will be able to pay for your parking by:

- card or contactless at the machine in the car park
- the MiPermit app or website
- automated call

Easter Biscuits

Traditionally in this area, these are flavoured with oil of cassia, which may not be to everyone's taste but make these a special treat for those who do like it.

Ingredients

4ozs butter 4ozs caster sugar

8ozs plain flour 1 egg

4-5 drops cassia oil 2ozs currants

Method

- Cream butter and sugar.
- Beat in egg and cassia oil.
- Fold in flour and currants.
- Roll out on floured board to 1/4 inch thickness.
- Cut out biscuit shapes.
- Bake at 350°F/180°C/Reg 4 for 15 minutes



Make Eastertide Tansies

'To make a Tansy. Take three pints of Cream, fourteen New-laid eggs (the whites of seven put away) one pint of juice of Spinnach, six or seven spoonfuls of juice of Tansy, a Nutmeg (or two) grated small, half a pound of sugar, and a little salt.

Beat all these well together, then fry it in a pan with no more Butter than is necessary.

When it is enough, serve it up with juice of Orange or slices of Lemon upon it.'

Trees around Tortworth

As the Tortworth Forest Centre celebrates its tenth anniversary, it might be an appropriate time to remember the person who was responsible for planting the first of the many interesting trees which may be found around this small community. These are the legacy of the third Earl of Ducie, who was a great dendrologist in his day and developed a fine arboretum at Tortworth Court, though he is perhaps most famous for having discovered the Corkscrew Hazel, Corylus avellana 'Contorta' in a hedge on the estate.



He was responsible for the bulk of the ornamental planting, developed in amicable competition with Robert Holford of Westonbirt. By 1921, when the third Earl died, the arboretum was widely admired for its collection. Many of these trees may still be seen in the grounds of De Vere Tortworth Court Hotel, the Forest Centre and the church.
