If you are going into or in hospital...
You can help to make sure that the church team can respond as you would like us to when you

It's important that if you are admitted to hospital, you do three things:-

- Make sure someone tells one of the ministry team that you are going into hospital – ask them to pass on the message as appropriate.
- Make it plain to the hospital staff whether (or not!) you would like a visit. This means that when someone rings up, they won't have to spend time saying 'hang on, 'I'll just ask him/her...'
- 3. Make it plain what sort of visit you would like: would you prefer a friend from the church or one of the visiting team or would you particularly like a clergy visit? If you want to be certain of a private, one to one chat, don't be afraid to ask the hospital staff if they will allow your minister to come outside normal visiting hours, so that they don't take up precious time and space from your family.



Falfield WI News – March 2018



- At this meeting we welcomed 2 new members and congratulated 3 ladies with birthdays this month.

- Tickets were distributed for the Avon Group Spring Meeting on 22nd March.
- We were advised to refer to the Avon News for details of: the trip on the Matthew in May and the visit to Acton Court in July as numbers for both are limited.

After refreshments, we were entertained and educated by a member of the Queen's Bodyguard of the Yeoman of the Guard, Shaun McCormack. He spoke about the history of the Guard, created in 1485 by Henry VII after the battle of Bosworth Field to provide protection for the monarch; it has provided this service ever since. He brought his uniform for us to see and hold - it is very heavy and as he said difficult to wear in hot weather e.g. at garden parties at Buckingham Palace. The uniform has not changed for 533 years except for the gold embroidered initials and insignia of the monarch, which are replaced. There are 71 men in the Guard and six officers currently no women, but there are now two on the waiting list. A fascinating and educative talk delivered by a man with a twinkle in his

The bells! The bells!

Three of the churches in our benefice have active groups of bell-ringers who practice regularly and are always keen to attract new members. Is it something you could do?

What is it? It's a traditional English activity, which provides exercise for the mind and body, a lifetime of leaning options, social contact, a guaranteed welcome in 5000+ church towers, etc.

How long does it take to learn? Like everything else, it depends, but typically a few months to learn to ring a bell safely and start to ring with the other ringers (the 'band'). It's a bit like riding a bicycle - it seems hard at first, but once you've got the idea, you'll never forget.

Who can learn? Anyone between 9 and 90+

What happens when I've learnt to ring?

You'll be able to ring for Sunday church services (the prime purpose of the bells is to call people to church) and for weddings. You can start to enjoy visiting other church towers, learning different 'tunes' (we call them methods), doing the ringing equivalent of the marathon (a peal, roughly 3 hours of non-stop ringing), meeting people from all walks of life with the same interest, sharing a pint with them in the local pub after the ringing, the list goes on and on.

How do I get started then? Go along to your local tower to see what it's all about, you'll get a very friendly welcome.

Plastic, the Environment and your Village Shop

There has been an awful lot in the press and on the television recently about plastic and its impact on the environment. The major supermarkets have been very slow in trying to discourage their customers love of plastic. Your local Village shop has decided to take the lead and from May we will be reducing our reliance on plastic in the shop. The majority of our bread bags will be wholly biodegradable, while we have stock of plastic fruit & veg bags we will offer both paper or plastic until our plastic stock runs out, we will also offer paper carrier bags at a cost of 5p.


The meeting opened with the singing of Jerusalem, followed by a

New play area planned for Thornbury's Mundy Playing Fields



Thornbury Town Council is continuing its programme of investment into new play areas, with plans to completely refurbish the play facilities at the Mundy Playing Fields, investing £85,000 in a new play area. We have appointed Proludic as our play contractor who will design and install the new play area before the summer holidays.

This will involve replacing the majority of the old equipment and safety surfacing, whilst retaining and incorporating the splash pad, zip wire, embankment slides, roundabout, climbing frame and balance bars. The adult exercise equipment will also be relocated away from the children's play area and the play area will continue to remain unfenced.

We aim to provide an inclusive play space that can be used for all children aged up to

16, split between a dedicated toddler area based around the splash pad and linked by the slides to the main children's play area. Working with Proludic and based on consultation undertaken last year, we have drawn up designs that we want the communities views on, before we place the final order for the equipment. We are particularly keen to hear from people as to which pieces of play equipment can be added to the core design, whether we are providing the right range of play activities and any suggestions that could improve the play area.

FALFIELD PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

Prior to their normal monthly meeting in February, Councillors had a short meeting with Cotswold Homes to provide some clarity on the intentions for their recently approved 'Outline' planning application at Heneage Farm.

A more detailed 'Reserved Matters' planning application to consider the layout, scale, appearance and landscaping of their development has yet to be submitted to South Gloucestershire Council. Cotswold Homes stated that the Community Hub did not form part of the reasoning in granting the Outline consent and as such there was no requirement on them to construct a Community Hub. However they indicated that the landowner has confirmed that he would 'gift' land for a Community Hub to St George's Scouts and also make a contribution towards the construction of the building. Cotswold Homes confirmed that they would undertake the required highways works for access to the Park & Share and create a smaller number of parking spaces initially. At this stage Cotswold Homes were waiting for South Gloucestershire Council to confirm the number of spaces to be provided in the first phase.

Cotswold Homes also confirmed that all highways work would be completed before any development took place as required under the conditions set by the planning approval. On timings, they expect to submit their 'Reserved Matters' Application in the late summer of 2018 and at best would be commencing on site in February 2019. However this is also subject to work being undertaken by Wessex Water to increase the available capacity of the existing mains foul sewage system which flows to the sewage treatment works in Leyhill and until this is resolved building work will not commence.

At the meeting that followed, the usual business took place which included the District Councillor's and Clerk's reports. The Council had been notified by Stroud District Council of an application for a Street Trading Licence for the A38 Stone Lay-by to which, following discussion, Councillors agreed to raise an objection on environmental grounds. It was also agreed that the Parish Council should have their own web site in order to fall within the requirements of the Transparency Code. Finally, Councillors also agreed to respond to the South Gloucestershire Local Plan consultation which they would formally discuss at their subsequent March and April meetings.



Have you heard of Charles Bonnet Syndrome?

The site Charity RP Fighting Blindness is helping to publicise the Campaign Group Esme's Umbrella, which is for everyone working towards raising awareness of Charles Bonnet Syndrome (CBS), a condition, which causes silent visual hallucinations in people with little or no sight.

Charles Bonnet Awareness has been launched to help spread the word of this condition both within the sight loss community and the wider general public conscious. Some people are living with CBS in frightened silence, not wanting to share their hallucinations with anyone and thinking they are developing dementia.

Too often the condition is misdiagnosed as dementia because too few healthcare professionals are aware of CBS, and ophthalmologists do not always warn their patients with low vision that CBS might develop. The hallucinations range from disturbing to terrifying and, because they come from the brain, are sharp and clear. This means that the teeth and saliva of a tiger, the worms and slugs on scrambled eggs or the fast-flowing river rushing through the room, are all too real.

The next meeting is on Tuesday 5th June at The Tortworth Estate Office at 7.30pm. All parishioners are welcome and are able to participate in the meeting.




