FALFIELD POST OFFICE NEWS

From the close of business on Saturday 3rd December, the Post Office will be permanently closed on a Saturday. This decision was not taken lightly but the very small number of transactions processed makes opening totally uneconomical.



We shall continue to operate a full Post Office service on Monday – Friday, 9.00am – 5.30pm, with no lunchtime closing.

We are aware that such a change is not welcome but is necessary. However, we will be able to offer some Post Office services through the retail area, such as: phone topups, electric and gas top-ups (for those on pre-payment meters), lottery products and standard 1st & 2nd class stamps. The shop will also be offering a 'cashback' facility up to £50.00.


The Royal Mail collection from the Post Box is unaffected and is normally made at about midday on a Saturday.

During the winter months, we shall be closing the shop one hour earlier on a Sunday, at 4.30pm, from 4th December.



Tytherington Parish Local Nature Action Plan

Tytherington Parish Council in partnership with South Gloucestershire Council has recognised the importance of taking steps to address the ecological crisis our world is facing.

We have committed to producing a Local Nature Action Plan (LNAP) to help guide our efforts to protect and enhance our parish for people and wildlife.

We would like to hear from any residents who are interested in getting involved with this initiative.

Biodiversity

Biodiversity is the whole variety of life on Earth, all the species of plants and animals, their genetic variation and the habitats and ecosystems they are part of.

The State of Nature

Our biodiversity has suffered some huge declines most recently in the last 10 to 30 years and this will affect all the natural services it provides for us, just a few are explained below:

- Pollination (Three thirds of all our crops rely on wild pollinators)
- Good mental health {We all feel the calming effects of a walk in the countryside)
- Flood protection (Healthy nature rich land is better as preventing floods and protecting us when they do occur)
- Heat protection (Our summers are becoming hotter and drier, the shade and cooling from our trees, hedgerows and nature rich areas will be so important in protecting us from ex tremes of heat)
- Soil formation (It can take up to 100 years for the natural formation of biodiversity rich soil)
- Carbon Storage (To help combat climate change we need healthy nature rich land to lock in carbon and slow down the heating of our world)

Our Parish

We are lucky to have some great public open spaces and nature reserves but recognise that if we want to bring back nature we need everyone's support.

Ideas might be:

Hedgehog Heroes - Getting more access for hedgehogs into gardens, bulk purchasing of hedgehog homes (Possibly threatened with extinction, suffered a decline of 30 million).

Flying friends - Supporting the installation of more nest boxes throughout our community -Ji (There has been an estimated decline of breeding birds by 44 million).

Trees & Bees - We could jointly purchase trees with residents to plant into gardens and so grow our tree canopy across the Parish, they could be ornamentals or fruit trees. We could also look at wild flower seed give aways if anyone is interested in setting aside a small patch in their garden for nature.

There are many great ideas online. Please check the Tytherington PC website and look for Local Nature Action Plans under Tytherington Countryside, lots of project ideas and further details about LNAPs. There is also a link to the start of the nature map for our parish.

FALFIELD PARISH COUNCIL

With the exception of Councillor Gregory, who had tendered his apologies, all Councillors were present along with four members of the public.

During Public Participation, a Parishioner commented on the number of individuals using the open space on the Linden Homes development to walk their dogs and asked whether a Dog waste bin could be installed at the kissing gate on the public footpath where it leads off Sundayshill Lane into the Linden Homes development. Councillors instructed the Clerk to contact Linden Homes to asked if they would be willing to place a dog waste bin at this point.

Parishioners also raised their concern over the proposed expansion of HMP Eastwood Park. The Chair, Cllr Jarvis, advised the public present that the Parish Council would note all their concerns and once the prison's planning applications had been submitted, displaying their final design proposals, the Parish Council would be able to formally comment as a consultee.

Ward Cllr O'Neill informed the meeting of the progress of the South Gloucestershire Local Plan which was expected to be adopted in either 2024 or 2025. He informed the meeting that the planning application for the re-opening of Charfield station had now been submitted, Councillors discussed this later in the meeting and they agreed to defer making any comments until their next meeting He also provided an update on the future of the Park and Share off Moorslade Lane where he indicated that it was still unclear as to whether it would transfer into public or private ownership as the developers had placed it on the open market.

As this meeting had been postponed from October Councillors agreed to hold their next meeting on Monday 5th December at which the Council's budget and Parish Precept for 2023/2024 would be set.



Recipe for Christmas Flapjack

Makes 8 - 12 pieces

Make sure you cook this a little in advance of when you need it to allow this to cool completely before you cut into it or it will fall apart.

Ingredients:

- 100g Butter
- 75g Dark Brown Sugar
- 75g Golden Syrup
- 150g Mincemeat
- 3 tbsp rum (or brandy)
- 200g Rolled oats

Method:

- Melt the sugar, syrup and butter together, either on the hob or in the microwave.
- Mix the oats, rum and mincemeat in a mixing bowl. Add the sugar/butter mixture and stir thoroughly until evenly combined.
- Line a small baking tin (about 20cm by 15cm) with baking parchment and pour the flapjack mixture in. If you don't have a small baking tin - a shallow ovenproof dish will do
- Bake for 25-30 minutes at 170 C, 325 F,
 Gas mark 3 until golden on top.
- Allow the flapjack to cool completely before you cut it into squares,
 (Refrigerating it for an hour or so helps the flapjack to keep together as you cut it.)
