#### **Looking forward to Christmas?**



Is December still the time of year when children look forward to building snowmen in their gardens? We seldom get heavy snowfall these days and the snow that does fall, soon melts away. As a child in the 1940's, I remember waking up and hearing cars driving along the road with chains on their wheels. I knew what that meant and would excitedly pull back the curtains, breathe on the icy windowpane to look outside (no double glazing then!) and be excited to see the blanket of snow that covered the road and gardens. Perfect for building snowmen!

For churchgoers, the four weeks leading up to Christmas day is known as Advent, a season of remembering and celebrating the arrival of Jesus on Earth. In churches, and in some homes, you will see an Advent wreath. This, like the wreaths on many front doors, is made from evergreen cuttings and is circular in shape, representing the eternal nature of God, His never-ending love, mercy, and faithfulness. It also symbolizes the unending cycle of seasons and the continuous nature of time.



There are usually five candles in the wreath, three are purple because, in churches, this is the colour that signifies a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice. The other candle is pink and symbolizes joy. One candle is lit each Sunday in Advent, celebrating the four main themes of Advent: hope, peace, joy and love. The light from the candles represents the light of Christ coming into the world.

On Christmas Day the central candle is lit to symbolize the birth of Jesus, the Light of the World. Why not visit your village church and have a look?



St Andrew's church in Cromhall invite you to join them on Sunday Dec 15th at 4pm for an **Advent carol service with Oldland Bass band**. There will be carols and Christmas readings in a candlelit church, and mulled wine and mince pies in the interval. A wonderful way to hear the Christmas story.

For adults, December can be a busy and expensive time; It is all too easy to get wrapped up in present buying and roast dinners and forget the true spirit of Christmas. It is a time to remember those less fortunate than ourselves, to share kindness, offer forgiveness, and express gratitude with all our loved ones, friends and neighbours.

## Thornbury Radio launches on Digital Radio (DAB) across South Gloucestershire



Listeners in South Gloucestershire can now hear Thornbury Radio on Digital Radio (DAB) following the successful launch of a new DAB mul-

tiplex covering much of South Gloucestershire.

Local not for profit company, South Glos Digital Community Interest Company (SGDCIC), has successfully launched its SSDAB operation covering a large part of South Gloucestershire. Supported by Thornbury Radio, generous community donations and grants from Thornbury Town Council and Thornbury Rotary.

SGDCIC was successfully awarded the licence by Ofcom to run Digital Radio services covering Thornbury, Yate and Almondsbury areas. The DAB coverage region covers a large part of the South Gloucestershire, along with the crossroads of the M4 and M5 corridors.

David Wrench, Director of SGDCIC said, "Our DAB transmissions will benefit listeners across South Gloucestershire by bringing them a wider choice of radio stations including a new way to listen to Thornbury Radio."

Thornbury Radio already covers 45,000 people in and around Thornbury and has many volunteers working together at the station. DAB transmissions run by SGDCIC now give listeners of the popular local station the option to listen on DAB as well as FM, smart speaker and online. This makes the station even more accessible to listeners, community groups and local events which are promoted on air, and local businesses advertising. # Get a free carbon monoxide alarm as well as advice on avoiding dangers of 'silent killer' gas

Citizens Advice South Gloucestershire is offering members of the public free carbon monoxide alarms as well as advice. Carbon monoxide is a poisonous gas produced by some household appliances if they are installed or used incorrectly. The gas can't be seen or smelled and can cause death

Anyone concerned about carbon monoxide in their home can claim a free alarm as well as advice from a vital South Gloucestershire charity. Citizens Advice South Gloucestershire is giving free carbon monoxide alarms along with advice on how to avoid the dangers of the poisonous gas.

Carbon monoxide poisoning is responsible for 40 deaths and around 4,000 A&E visits in England and Wales each year.

Anyone wanting to get their free alarm should arrange an appointment with the charity.

Lead Supervisor Emmanuelle Claverie said: "The symptoms of poisoning are very similar to common illnesses and a carbon monoxide alarm is the best way to protect yourself and become aware when there is an issue in your home. We can provide a free carbon monoxide alarm to anyone who comes to us for advice about the issue."

To book an appointment, please call the charity's Admin Office Answerphone on 01454 334961 and leave a message with your name, telephone number and state that you would like a call back about carbon monoxide advice.

Advisers will be able to call back on Mondays and Wednesday afternoons.
