### The Church of England and the Parish Church

I'm writing just a few days after Justin Welby laid down his pastoral staff as Archbishop of Canter-



bury, he's now left Lambeth Palace and Canterbury Cathedral for the last time. It's a week in which we've been reminded so frequently of the abuse of young women and girls, of the abuse of young men and boys and of grooming gangs. It has covered every aspect of society and has left many people hurt with many who have suffered now feeling shame and guilt. In the midst of it the church has failed to respond appropriately to those who have suffered at the hands of church leaders and others.

I must say how profoundly sorry I am, and the clergy I know are, are for the hurt that so many have suffered and for the way in which the church has failed to listen to you and to support you. How the abuse has been wors-

ened by the cover-up, inaction, irresponsibility, indifference and inhumanity of many in the church, we are so sorry.

I am pleased that the church is now taking this seriously and working for change, to have independent oversight of safeguarding with church leaders and all in authority being held to account and treated equally. Importantly those who have been harmed in any way will now be taken seriously so that healing may begin.

Alongside the issues the national church has had to face, the church in the villages continues to seek to serve the community and to offer regular worship to God, to be here for you. Over the Christmas period I was delighted to share worship with you in three of the village churches.

As a retired vicar I'm pleased to help in these 5 parishes not only with the Sunday services but with weddings, baptisms and funerals. Having spent much of my active ministry in rural parishes, not dissimilar to those served by 5 Alive, I recognise the importance of village communities and for the church to play a vital part in the life of the community. I once heard of the local church being described as an "enigmatic presence," of having an unrecognised position in society but making a huge difference to the life of the place; nobody being quite sure why but recognising the importance of church. The church is, I believe, an outward sign of

God's continuing presence in the community.

Whilst I have to agree that there are issues with the Church of England and its structures of safeguarding and accountability, I do believe that the church in the parishes and villages is still alive and doing good work in support of the community, we are here for you. ### CROMHALL VILLAGE SHOP AND **POST OFFICE**

For the last four years the shop has not been financially viable. This is due to insufficient customers and rising costs, notably electricity, and following the AGM, the Association members regretfully voted to close the shop.

# The Shop will cease trading on 28<sup>th</sup> February 2025.

Until that date, while long life and slow selling items will not be replaced, regular deliveries of papers, milk, bread, meat and popular groceries will continue.

The closure of the shop means that the Post Office will also have to POST close. However, it is hoped that Tytherington Post Office will continue to operate. See page 18 for further information on this subject.



### **Olveston YFC**

As we enter Olveston Young Farmers' 90<sup>th</sup> year as a club, we have certainly had our hands full! At the start of the year, we arranged a Christmas Tree collection around the local areas, including Thornbury, Falfield, Berkeley, Alveston, Olveston, Almondsbury, Pilning, Tytherington and more! We had 5 trailers out collecting the trees over the weekend thanks to some of our members and advisory giving up their time and fuel to help. We managed to collect over 130 from these areas and raise over £900! This money will be split between club funds and

Gloucestershire Farming Friends, which is a charity offering mental health support to farmers and rural people within Gloucestershire. Fundraising is an important part of being a young farmer as all events we hold allow us to give back to the club, or other local charities to help make a difference.

At the end of the month, we held our annual charity tractor run. This is a highly-anticipated event with members from other clubs, as well as other farmers, bringing their tractor out for a ride and having a social catch up. The tractors met at Actrees Farm (Berkeley) before heading through Berkeley High Street, through Hill and Rockhampton, then through Thornbury and Alveston before finishing the run at Chandlers in Elberton for a BBQ. Here we also had a Dynamometer, which can test the horsepower of a tractor. This had a huge interest from our drivers as they all tested their tractors, which also raised more money for our charities.

At the end of February, we are holding our 90<sup>th</sup> Anniversary dinner and dance. This is one of the biggest and most glamorous events we have held as a club, as 90 years is a huge achievement. We will also be holding a raffle at this event with prizes kindly donated by many local businesses. South Glos foster carers benefit from financial support, comprehensive training, a dedicated social worker, and access to a therapeutic support team and 24-hour duty team.

The fostering community comes together with throughout the year for daytrips, family fun days and seasonal events. And smaller, family constellations connect even more regularly to support each other like extended family.

Every application to foster is considered on an individual basis and you can be a foster carer regardless of your marital status, sexuality, employment status, ethnicity, or religion. There is no upper age limit, but you do need to have a spare bedroom for a child or young person to use.

### **Tytherington & Itchington Parish Council**

The Council wishes all residents a very happy new year.

Exciting times are ahead as the Trustees of The Tytherington Recreation Ground also known as The Hardwicke Field, are considering replacing the old sports pavilion with a new one, using grant funding and CIL funds. The current pavilion is nearing the end of its life and a decision needs to be made about its future. Funds are also available to upgrade the play area on the Tytherington Recreation Ground by installing more play equipment. Residents may remember that there used to be several items of play equipment located near the pavilion with only the swings surviving now.

A consultation is due to be released soon that we encourage all residents to participate in, there are questions about the pavilion, use of the field and options presented around possible new play or exercise equipment residents would like to see on the Tytherington Recreation Ground. There is also a Business Plan on the web site in respect of the pavilion.

You can also access the Consultation on the newsletter by capturing the QR code. The newsletter will be available from the Village Shop from the beginning of February. There will also be an open morning in the pavilion on Hardwicke Field on Saturday 22nd February between 9 am and 12 noon where you can have a tour of the pavilion and have the opportunity to talk to the Trustees.

Two diseased ash trees will be taken down in the Jubilee Field before the end of February and if residents would like to email in with any preference in respect of replacement trees they will be considered by the Parish Council. These trees are owned by Heildelberg Materials who are organising this work.

There are still three vacancies on the Parish Council and if any resident would like to join the Parish Council to lighten the load then please get in touch with the clerk@tytherington-pc.gov.uk

The architectural tree stumps will be installed and a time capsule buried in land on the Walnut Fields development as soon as the architect has a free date. The date will be available to residents as soon as the PC are advised. Thank you to all those residents involved in gathering information for the time capsules.

Cllr Gordon is starting a Neighbourhood Plan, it is hoped this will help influence future developments in the village to ensure we really do get the best we can for our growing community. 



### **Tortworth Bells - a date for your diary**



### Jean Mary Brock (née Pitt) 1933 - 2024



With the death of Jean Brock, Tytherington has lost another of its stalwarts who contributed much to village life. Born and raised at The Huts in Tytherington, she was one of six siblings. After attending school in the village, she left at the age of fourteen to start her working life in the office at George Taylor (Radio & TV) in Stone. This meant a journey of some five miles each way, which she made on her bicycle, whatever the weather. Later, Jean went to work at Rolls Royce in the Payroll Department and eventually put those skills to work in the family business – Brock's Transport.

Like many of those growing up in small villages at that time, Jean's formative years were centred around the parish church where she was baptised, confirmed and later married. She was also a member of the choir and became a Sunday School teacher. During this time Jean was part of a group which, along with the vicar, Mr E Waddleton, presented a purse of money to the late Queen Elizabeth at the Royal Albert Hall. Much later in life, Jean was herself chosen to be 'Queen of the Village' for Queen Elizabeth's Platinum Jubilee – something she was very honoured to do!

As was the case for couples of that era, local dances provided the venue where many romances blossomed and it was at Rangeworthy Village Hall that Jean met Cyril, the love of her life. Their marriage, which began in 1955, lasted for 62 years and produced three children.



Alongside Cyril, Jean was noted for her loyal support of the Royal British Legion, a commitment which was recognised when, after 45 years of annual poppy-selling, she was presented with a medal.

Beyond the village activities, Jean took a keen interest in football was an avid Liverpool supporter. Other interests included the Tytherington Gymkhana and WI, of which she was president for 3 years. Alongside Cyril, The Friendship Club offered another opportunity for Jean's organisational skills to be put into effect as she arranged transport to make sure that everyone was able to attend. Hosting an afternoon tea for the club each summer was another activity which gave her pleasure.

Jean was essentially a 'people person', never happier than when entertaining people at her home or joining others in some social activity. Her out-going and friendly demeanour made her much-loved by many and she will be sorely missed. We offer our condolences to her family.

In view of the impending closure of Cromhall shop and Post Office, Philip has been in discussions with the management of Post Office Ltd about the future of Tytherington. This is because Tytherington is an Outreach branch of Cromhall PO.

The initial discussions with the regional management were encouraging and it looked as if Philip's proposal that Tytherington should be made the Core Branch in place of Cromhall would be acceptable.

Since then however, this suggestion has been turned down flat by the top management. Their statement was simply if the Core Branch closes the Outreach does too.

If you want to keep a Post Office in Tytherington, we need your help to:

- Contact Claire Young MP (she is aware of the situation) to emphasise the importance of the PO to you
- Sign a petition that Philip will put into the shop
- More importantly write an individual letter to Post Office 'On Board' team

   Claire Young

In the meantime, those most closely involved will be trying to find another Core Post Office to 'take us on' as an Outreach. Apparently we can continue as an Outreach if we can reach an arrangement with another Core branch – not our preferred option but better than losing the PO altogether, but not an easy task.
