Falfield Parish Council

In the absence of Cllr Jarvis Vice Chair Cllr Gregory chaired the meeting held on Monday 5th December 2022.

Before the business of the meeting commenced Cllr Gregory informed Cllrs of the deaths of the following individuals who had previously served on the Parish Council:

Mr Colin Murton who served from 2012 to 2015 and Mr Eddie Gadsby who served from 1987 to 2004 and was also Chair of the Council from 1989 to 2000.

The Clerk informed Cllrs that no nominations had been received during the period of notice for the two casual Cllr vacancies. As it was now less than six months before the next Parish elections are due to take place there is no requirement on the Council to actively fill these vacancies in the meantime.

Following the previous meeting when a member of the public requested whether a dog bin could be placed at the entrance to the Falfield Grange Open Space off Sundayshill Lane, the Clerk contacted Vistry to ask if they would be able to provide a dog bin at the footpath entrances to the Open Space off Sundayshill Lane and Moorslade Lane. Vistry responded that they had asked the Management Company Gateway to undertake ongoing monitoring of any dog litter being dropped before making any decision.


Ward Cllr John O'Neill provided an update on the Park & Share confirming that the original landowner had now purchased the land back from Vistry and had offered it to South Gloucestershire Council at a peppercorn rent although South Gloucestershire Council had not yet come to any decision. When asked by Cllr Salt, Cllr O'Neil confirmed that whoever is in ownership of this land is governed by the original planning conditions which state that the land can only be used in perpetuity as a Park & Share.

Cllrs approved the Council's budget and Parish precept at the meeting for 2023/2024 and given the expected increase expenditure Cllrs agreed to use £1,500 from its reserves to offset the increase in the precept. The Parish precept for 2023-2024 was set at £8,442.00 which would see a typical Band D property increase from £24.06 to £25.82 annually.

The first meeting of 2023 will take place on Tuesday 15th January commencing at 7.30pm.

TYTHERINGTON PARISH COUNCIL

Tytherington Parish Council wish all residents of Tytherington and Itchington a happy New Year.

This year the Parish Council are conducting a Consultation on some new play equipment in both the Jubilee Field and Hardwicke Field. It would be really helpful if as many of you as possible complete the on-line questionnaire.

The first part of the consultation is aimed at the youngsters in the village and what they would like to see happening. There is a QR code at the bottom of this article which should bring up the consultation, otherwise you can find it on www.tytherington-pc.gov.uk and the Tytherington Parish Council Facebook page.

The closing date is the 31st January 2023 and we will then hope to arrange a presentation by Wicksteed, the preferred contractor, in respect of the play and sports equipment. There are 4 £25 Love to Shop vouchers to win if you leave your email address on the consultation paper.

The S106 money available is from both the Walnut Field development and Stowell Hill Road developments and is designated funding to purchase new play/sport equipment for youngsters on both the Jubilee Field and Hardwicke Field. The PC already have funding to put a Multi-Use Games Area (MUGA) on the Hardwicke Field and also improve the play equipment on the Jubilee Field but there is now more funding to upgrade the projects.

The Vehicle Activated Sign (VAS) is now working at the top of Stowell Hill Road and it will be moved to Itchington Road in the new year. The PC are still waiting on the outcome of a grant from Larks Green Solar Farm, which will enable them to fund the purchase of solar panels on the roof of the village hall.

On 4th May 2023 local elections will be taking place, which includes Tytherington Parish Council. The Parish Council can only be as effective, relevant and vibrant as the people elected to run it, so we need councillors who are capable, energetic and engaged – from all backgrounds and experiences to reflect the community.

Being a councillor is highly rewarding - no other role gives you a chance to make such a huge difference to the quality of life of people in your local area and to influence the way

issues are dealt with locally. To fairly represent the village you would need to be able to commit a number of hours a week to your Council responsibilities.

Finally, it has been suggested that a Neighbourhood Plan be produced to try and control development in the Village. Speeding vehicles through the village was again the main topic of the meeting. Cllrs had agreed at their August meeting to look at the installation of 'Village Gates' on the Lower Stone Road, however on reflection it was agreed that, before any further steps were taken to obtain the necessary permissions and the purchase of any gates further calming measures should be investigated for the length of the road running from the entrance to the village from Lower Stone end through to Thornbury Rugby Club and Cllrs ask Ward Cllr Riddle if he would take these suggestions back to StreetCare. Cllr England realised that the cost for the supply and installation of the 'Village Gates' would be the responsibility of the Parish Council but would like to think that other calming measures proposed would be covered by StreetCare.

Cllrs approved donations of £50 each to the 4 Ward Magazine, 5 Alive Magazine and Citizens Advice. They also approved the Council's budget and Parish precept for 2023/2024. The Parish precept for 2023-2024 was set at £3,700.00 which would see the typical Band D property increase by £3.50 annually.
