At the risk of sounding like a 'visit Ireland' advert, or indeed treading on Fen's nature notes, I have to share a little of the joy of the past three weeks when I have been staying in Sean's Cottage** on the island of Inishnee, near Roundstone, Connemara....the isle is actually reached from the mainland by a proper bridge and several scruffy causeways which I gather are often very dodgy in winter.

I did wonder when I was searching for the cottage, if I was about to fall off the end of the world, as the two Irish miles turned out to be more than three, and seemed like twenty, up and down and round corners, a track which did not seem to be leading anywhere. But what a glorious view when I did arrive and I could hear a cuckoo

cuckooing to greet me, I thought 'how lovely'..... I was to live to regret this kind thought about that bird, which nearly drove me mad on occasion, shouting from the top of the power line running to the cottage. Yes, I was very privileged to be so close, but it had an uncanny way of flapping off just as I focused the camera !

Storm Hannah, hammering in from the Atlantic, made a very interesting first night in this isolated cottage. I saw on TV later, it caused wide swathes of damage and brought down power lines, but much to my relief my corner escaped. I was greeted next morning by sunshine, sparkling blue sea, skylarks, a robin announcing his presence, a wren busying around, a number of LBJs * and yes, the cuckoo. In the distance the Twelve Bens (or Pins as they are sometimes known locally) looked majestic, a range of steep mountains scraped bare in the Ice Age and really fascinating to watch as the changing light seems to alter them every few minutes.

I hope the preceding ramble sets a perfect landscape in your imagination, which I admit took my breath away on many occasions but there is a sting in the tail. So much of the land is now fenced with barbed wire and the foreshore inaccessible on the island. Talking to a local farmer, (yes, the Irish will happily stop and talk endlessly if you have the time, or if you don't!) I discovered this was a fairly recent happening caused by the increase in visitor numbers, (yes that was me too), disturbance by dogs to the livestock, traffic on previously little used by-ways and thoughtless damage to the land by visitors, that owners now discouraged rambling, although they rely heavily on the tourist trade, there being little fishing these days or other employment.

I thought that this was a huge shame until I drove down a single track road through the enormous Roundstone bog and stopped to take some photos of an ancient lichen covered tree and looked down into the edge of the bog and there was all sorts rubbish, plastic bottles, take away cartons, coffee cups and this miles from any habitation. I then took the time to look in other quiet spots and there again was 'stuff' someone thinks, "I don't want this," and chucks it anywhere. I have yet to see anyone throw stuff out of their car windows, so how does it get there ?

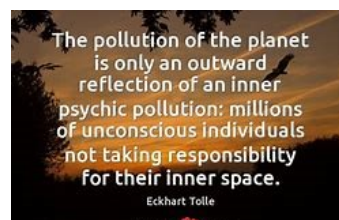
I was initially delighted that I only picked up two plastic bottles and an empty feed bag on my walk on a glorious white sandy beach, but when I took them back to the bin in the tiny car park, I found four black bin bags there already, crammed with detritus someone else had collected and on another beach I met a lady with two plastic bags full of cans and plastic she collects every day as she walks her dog. She commented that it was a small haul that day! And this is non-tourist season.

What are we doing to this wonderful world we are so privileged to share with the seal basking on a nearby sandbank, the serene Connemara ponies and donkeys and that noisy cuckoo.....what legacy are we leaving for our grandchildren? We all really do need to be re-educated, or the beauty I have marvelled at for three weeks will be ruined forever and our forefathers who made the country what it is today, will have toiled for naught. And how they must have toiled in that harsh landscape. Can we be the last generation to care? I do hope not.

Visiting is part of the Church's Ministry. If you would like a visit from the church, please call the Benefice Office or contact the Chaplain: **Rev Sue: 01454 600674 or revsue@crofft.org.uk** and we will do our best to arrange it.



If you are going into or in hospital... You can help to make sure that the church team can respond as you would like us to when you are ill. It's important that if you are admitted to hospital, you do three things:-

1. Make sure someone tells one of the ministry team that you are going into hospital – ask them to pass on the message as appropriate.
2. Make it plain to the hospital staff whether (or not!) you would like a visit. This means that when someone rings up, they won't have to spend time saying 'hang on, 'I'll just ask him/her...'
3. Make it plain what sort of visit you would like: would you prefer a friend from the church or one of the visiting team or would you particularly like a clergy visit? If you want to be certain of a private, one to one chat, don't be afraid to ask the hospital staff if they will allow your minister to come outside normal visiting hours, so that they don't take up precious time and space from your family.

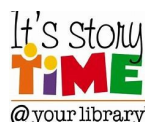

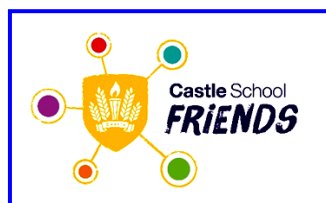

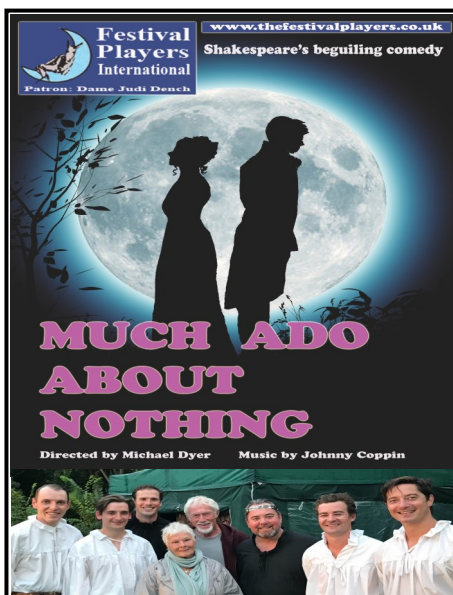

Roadworks: Advance notification of roadworks on the B4509, there will be resurfacing work on the B4509 that will require a full road closure between the 10th and 14th June. The work is planned 350

metres east of the A38 junction to resurface a 220 metre stretch of road (the overbridge at M5 junction 14) This will be night work from 8pm in the evening to 6am in the morning, but still likely to have an impact on those trying access the M5.

Planning application P19/3928/RM is now live and available on the Council website for those who wish to comment, this is the reserved matters application for the 85 homes at Henage Farm and deals with the site content such as type of homes, drainage, open spaces, landscaping and the park and share.

We are now aware that the JSP that proposes **major development at Buckover and Charfield** will commence the examination in public in July, this will be in two stages with the first part dealing with the technical issues and the second stage recommencing in October to deal with the strategic development locations such as Buckover and Charfield, this means that a decision is unlikely to be reached before early 2020.

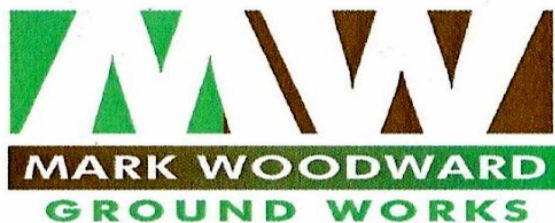

The next meeting is our annual picnic which is on 4th June at 7.30pm.

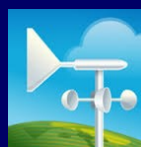

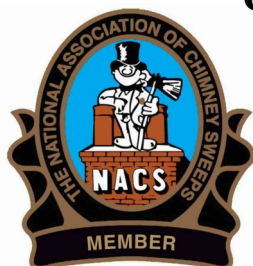

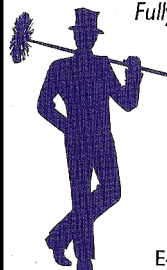

Thornbury Radio applies for full time licence

Thornbury's local radio station's Directors have confirmed that the station has submitted their application to Government regulator Ofcom to operate a full time FM radio service for Thornbury and district nearly 2 years after it recommenced webcasts in the summer of 2017. If successful, the station will be easily receivable in Thornbury and district and over a wide area of South Gloucestershire covering key commuter routes.

Messages in support of the application were received from many local stakeholders, including local churches, doctors, charities, emergency services and clubs and societies, reflecting the aim of the station to give a voice to the people of Thornbury and district and be a channel device to improve communication and social cohesion in the area.

Following an online questionnaire, the station has built its application around what the people of Thornbury and district say that they want - a wide selection of music from the 80's to the current date and lots of local information and discussion. A key aim of the station is to give Thornbury its voice back on the FM airwaves.

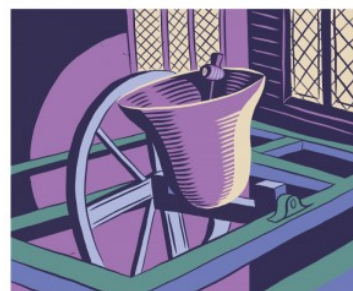
The station continues its local radio service 24 hours a day at www.glossfm.co.uk.
