International days, observed by the United Nations, are typically decided upon by UN Member States proposing them to the General Assembly, which then votes on the establishment of a Day. Once ratified by the General Council, International days are said to serve various purposes, including raising awareness about global issues, mobilizing political will and resources, and celebrating achievements of humanity. Well, that makes it clear, or does it?

Do you hear about any of these activities? I don't seem to have come across them and I read several newspapers, scan the internet for news, watch TV or am I living under a stone? It's probably a little provocative to wonder if the effort of establishing quite so many, with all the

resources obviously needed for doing 'something' on the day, perhaps detracts from some of the core issues afflicting our world.

On a lighter note, national days seem to mark less serious topics; I also found that apart from my brioche day, there are in June: Flip a Coin, Go Barefoot, Dinosaur, Leave the Office Early, Cider Day - and these are just the ones that made me smile. There are plenty more, some perhaps worthy of thought, but it begs the question are they really seriously designated days somewhere or just a hook for yet another publicity stunt? Many of them seem to originate in the USA and perhaps we can forgive them, they need such distractions at the moment. *(How much longer before we have a Donald Trump Day?)*



No, I have not forgotten that there are days which really are important to acknowledge and that has been clear to us all in May, the remembrances around VE Day and later in the year VJ Day as well as other days when we remember those who have given their lives for a cause.

Falfield Parish Council Report

The Annual Parish meeting took place on Monday 19th May which was chaired by the outgoing Chair of the Parish Council Emma Jarvis along with three other Councillors in attendance, the Clerk and one parishioner. The minutes of the Annual Parish meeting held on the 20th May 2024 were approved. This was followed by ClIr Jarvis providing a report on the activities of the Parish Council over the preceding 12 months. The Clerk also provided a financial report for the year ending 31st March 2025. There were no items raised by electors of the parish.

This meeting was followed by the Annual Parish Council meeting (APCM) at which Cllr Emma Jarvis was re-elected as Chair.

As usual at each APCM, it was noted that the Council's various policies had been reviewed and were up to date. The Council's Financial Receipts and Expenditure Statement for the financial year ending 31st March 2025 were approved and it was noted that the internal audit had been completed without any issues being reported. Councillors also approved Council's Annual Governance and Accountability Return for the financial year ending 31st March 2025 which would be forwarded on to the External Auditors for examination and would also be published on the Council's website from early June onwards.

Two planning applications had been received since the April meeting and these were considered and observations made. The planned alterations to the A38 northbound between Sundayshill Lane and the Village Hall along with the relocation of the Bus Shelter adjacent to the War Memorial was again discussed. The Clerk informed Councillors that after making several attempts since the last meeting to obtain further information on the proposals from the Engineer responsible for this project at South Gloucestershire Council, no response had been forthcoming. It was agreed to ask our Ward Councillor if he could assist the Parish Council in obtaining details on this proposal.

The Parish Council currently have two Councillor vacancies of its total allowance of seven. For anyone who may be interested in becoming a Parish Councillor more information can be found on the Council's website home page or by contacting the Clerk.

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on **Monday 16th June** in the Village Hall commencing at 7.30pm.

Climate Action

The way we produce and use energy needs to change. We need a lot more energy from renewable sources like wind and solar to meet the UK's climate targets. At the same time, it's difficult for many people to keep their homes warm in winter, even though it's essential for health and wellbeing. Staying warm in winter is a basic right for everyone.

Community-led energy projects keep benefits local – from cheaper energy bills to investment in local facilities. When communities lead energy projects, they create solutions that work for everyone – tackling both climate change and rising energy costs.

Climate Action Thornbury and Surrounding Areas (CATSA) are hosting an interactive workshop, which will be a space for local people to share thoughts on community energy in the area. CATSA has partnered with the Centre for Sustainable Energy who will help deliver this workshop.

The workshop will explore how Falfield, Cromhall and Tortworth can play a role in the UK's national efforts to take climate action – thinking about what renewable energy could happen in your area and how it could benefit the local community.

The workshop is aimed at anyone who lives or works in the Falfield, Cromhall and Tortworth area. Everyone is welcome - if you have an opinion on community energy, we want to hear






Written by Ashley Burgoyne and directed by Sue Smith, 'The Village Hall' promises to be a real hoot!

Tytherington & Itchington Parish Council

Thank you to all the residents who completed the recent Consultation on a possible new pavilion/ Community Hub on the Hardwicke Field/Tytherington Recreation Ground. The complete results are on the Parish Council website www.tytherington-pc.gov.uk. A brief summary is that 93% would like to see a new pavilion/Community Hub on the Hardwicke Field. 95% said they would use the pavilion/community hub, 68% said they would consider hiring the facility, 51% would like to see more play equipment on the site and 60% would like to see an adult gym on the field. Therefore, on this result the Parish Council will be forming a pavilion committee and would like to welcome residents of Tytherington & Itchington who would be willing to join this committee and help with the planning. Please contact the clerk on clerk@tytherington-pc.gov.uk if you would like to be involved.

Tytherington & Itchington Parish Council currently has four Councillors in office, with three vacancies remaining. A full council enables more comprehensive support for Parishioners throughout the year.

The Council's responsibility is to represent the interests of all residents of the Parish, including environmental issues, planning applications, the maintenance and enhancement of open spaces, community facilities, and recreational matters.

"I do not want to be a burden" It is surprising how many people say "I do not want to be a burden to my family as I get older".

John Baden-Daintree at local experts Simpson Solicitors says he hears it most days from clients. He thinks they mean that as they get older, most people hope that they will supported by those they feel closest to. But at the same time they don't want to make the lives of those people even more busy and stressful than they already are.



So how do you get the support you will need, without being a hassle to your friends and family? John thinks it is all about some taking some simple steps now:-

1: Make sure your Will is up to date and any gifts are clearly described (be it items or amounts of money).

- A professionally prepared Will is always the best way to make sure there will not be any legal problems left behind for your family to sort out.
- Your legal advisor will make sure the Will is legally valid and has clear descriptions of gifts to avoid family disputes over what is meant.
- They will also make sure that if you are leaving someone out of your Will, you have prepared a clear statement as to what you are doing and why. This will then make it hard for your Will to be successfully challenged.

2: Appoint the people you trust in Lasting Powers of Attorney.

- Whilst you may not want to be a burden, these are also the people that are most likely to want to be able to help and support you as you get older. Especially if you became seriously ill.
- The greatest help you can be to them is to formally appoint them now in Lasting Powers of Attorney. Even your husband or wife or partner or adult children will need to be formally appointed to be able to help you in such a situation. Otherwise, they will feel helpless and shut out from providing the support you need.
- Worse, if not properly appointed they will face a long and expensive court process to be appointed by a judge to help you, rather than just being able to step in and provide the support you need. Now that really is a burden.

Martin Lewis (money saving expert) has highlighted on his TV show, that last year alone 51,000 applications were rejected as not properly made. Often this is only found out when it is too late and the person has lost mental capacity. That is why he says the gold standard is to use a law firm to draw up and register your Lasting Powers of Attorney at Court (Office of the Public guardian). This is to make it as smooth a process as possible for those you trust to be legally able to step in and speak up for you and help you over medical matters and managing your money.

3: Have a safe place at home where you keep the information your family will need to help you.

- Your family may need details of all the places where you keep or invest your money.
- An up-to-date list of the names and addresses of all the people or organisations you would want contacted if you became seriously ill or died.
- Key documents such as a photocopy of your Will and Powers of Attorney, property deeds (or Land Registry title numbers) and birth and marriage certificates.

John advises that if you keep them under lock and key or in a safe, then it is important that those you most trust know where you keep that key or
