### **Jean Grudgings 1928 – 2023**



Jean was a well-known resident of Tytherington from 1967 until her death on 1<sup>st</sup> January this year. She and her husband, Peter, moved to the village when he became head of the local school.

Jean's strong belief in non-violence and commitment to peace and disarmament movements was reinforced by her Quaker faith; she saw for herself the effects of the gas attack which had led to her father being invalided out of the trenches in WW1 and the devastation of bombing in post-war London when she worked as a housing officer in the East End. As an early member of the Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament and a Greenham Common protestor in the 1980s, Jean was one

of the founders of the Thornbury Peace Group and Women to Women for Peace.

Jean understood the importance of education in creating co-operative and caring communities and as the loving mother of four children she was one of the founders of the Tytherington Play Group. Later she would take her grandchildren to the annual Quaker Camp week where the emphasis was on living together as a community. In the 1970s she retrained as a teacher and worked at Failand School for many years.

Other village organisations also played a part in Jean's life, including the establishment of the Village Shop and the Local History Group. She was also a member of the Tytherington Countryside Group and served as a warden for the common land on Tytherington Hill. Her deafness led her to help with the setting-up and hosting of local hard of hearing and lip-reading groups, but her interests were wide-ranging and she also served as a director of Thornbury and District Heritage Trust as well as supporting her son Steve's work with South Gloucestershire Mines Research Group.

In 1979 Jean and Peter moved to Townsend Orchard where they put their passion for nature into action by replanting one of the few remaining local cider orchards. Sheep, goats, chickens and geese also found their way to Townsend Orchard at various times and hedgerows and trees were replanted across their land and wells brought back into use.

Jean was an active member of the Gloucestershire Orchards Trust working with others locally to restore orchards and protect trees and an invitation for people to come to visit the orchard and enjoy the apple blossom in May was a regular feature of the local magazine. The resulting harvest of the apples may be found in locally produced ciders and apple juices.

Jean was a woman of principle who lived a full and active life with many wide ranging interests but most importantly she did so with enduring good humour, humility, honesty and integrity; she will be missed by all who knew her.

We have reluctantly decided to increase our charges for advertising by 5% from April to help offset any potential increase in our outgoings. I hope our advertisers understand the reason for the increase.\*



### **INTRODUCTION OF VOTER ID IN MAY 2023**

The UK Government has introduced a requirement for voters to show photo ID when voting at a polling station at some elections. This new requirement will apply for the first time in England at the local elections on Thursday 4 May 2023.

Which forms of ID you can use: You may already have a form of photo ID that is acceptable. You can use any of the following:

- Passport
- Driving licence (including provisional licence)
- Blue badge
- Certain concessionary travel cards
- Identity card with PASS mark (Proof of Age Standards Scheme)
- Biometric Immigration document
- Defence identity card
- Certain national identity cards

For more information on which forms of photo ID will be accepted, visit electoralcommission.org.uk/voterID or call their helpline on 0800 328 0280.

If you do not have an accepted form of photo ID If you don't already have an accepted form of photo ID, or you're not sure whether your photo ID still looks like you, you can apply for a free voter ID document, known as a Voter Authority Certificate. You can apply for this at voter-authority-certificate.service.gov.uk.

Alternatively, you can complete a paper application form and send this to the electoral services team at your local council.

If you need any help with applying for a Voter Authority Certificate or want to request an application form, contact your local council. To find their contact details visit electoralcommission.org.uk/voter.







### **CROMHALL PARISH COUNCIL**

In January we had an Extraordinary Parish Council meeting regarding the planning application for a 25MW solar farm at Varley Farm, Talbot's End. This was a well-attended meeting, and members of the public were given time to express their support or objection to the proposal.

The planning application at the time of writing has seen 100 objecting and 10 supporting comments. By far the largest response I have seen for a local planning application.

Parish Council Clerk We find ourselves in a position where we are again looking for a Parish Clerk, one long-standing clerk left in November. And a new clerk was appointed at the start of December, but sadly this appointment did not work out..

The role of Parish Clerk & RFO is key in enabling the Parish Council to function. Without the clerk in position, for instance, we will not have as many regular monthly meetings.

If you or someone you know is interested in this role, please check the Parish Council website for details of how to apply.

Parish Council Meetings We now have a new regular slot for the Parish Council Meetings, from January they will be held on the 4th Tuesday of each month, at 7.30pm in Cromhall Village Hall. The reason for the change was to allow the hall to be used weekly on a Wednesday for another event.

Parish Council Member There is a need for new members to join the Parish Council, we are being increasingly targeted for large site housing schemes, solar farms and other such applications, as well as increased pressure on amenities, bus routes etc. The parish Council cannot help defend these issues without a diverse and a robust number of Councillors.

If you are interested in becoming a Parish Councillor, there is highly likely to be 1 position vacant at the upcoming elections in May, please contact myself to discuss.

If you have any feedback, or concerns about the village please, come along to the next Parish Council meeting on 28<sup>th</sup> March where members of the public are welcome to attend and raise issues during public participation.

### **South Gloucestershire Hedgehog Heroes**

Tytherington Parish Council declared a Climate and Nature Emergency on 25<sup>th</sup> October 2021. As part of this declaration, we have joined in with South Gloucestershire Councils (SGC) Local Nature Action Plan (LNAP) initiative and the first project this year is South Gloucestershire Hedgehog Heroes.



This is a joint project between up to 15 Town and Parish Councils alongside SGC to help our much beloved native hedgehog thrive. Hedgehog have suffered very dramatic declines over the last 30 years, recently being added to the UK red list for British mammals as 'Vulnerable to Extinction'.

There is a very real risk that our next generation could grow up without experiencing this wonderful animal. Hedgehogs are our only spiny animal, having up to 6000 spines in their coat. These spines are made of Keratin

the same substance as our hair and nails. The spines act as a defensive mechanism against predators as hedgehogs can roll themselves up into a tight ball when threatened.

Hedgehogs thrive in hedges, field edges, woodlands and gardens. They are nocturnal animals mainly relying on their sense of smell and hearing to get around safely. Unfortunately there are many man made threats which have contributed to their decline such as:

- Roads traffic collisions and habitat fragmentation
- **Habitat loss** intensive farming, tidy gardens, garden fences
- Chemicals insecticides and slug pellets
- Drowning unguarded swimming pools and ponds

### How can you help?

We need as many residents as possible to open up their gardens to nature, in particular hedgehogs. The project seeks to secure access to over 3000 gardens across South Gloucestershire for our spiny little friends.

- Make a 13cm hole in the base of your garden fence
- Raise your garden gate so there is a 13cm gap beneath it
- Ensure your garden pond has a ramp to escape it
- Leave a wild corner in your garden for nature
- Make a log pile in your garden
- Go chemical free
- Install a hedgehog house

Record your hedgehog hole and any sightings on The Big Hedgehog Map at www.bighedgehogmap.org and record it on the South Gloucestershire Hedgehog Heroes regional layer.

Contact the Parish Clerk at clerk@tytherington-pc.gov.uk or telephone 416637 for your free hedgehog hole sign and be entered into our competition to win a hedgehog care package. There will be 3 prizes which will include a hedgehog house, a food and water bowl and a bag of delicious hedgehog food. The Parish Council will also be running a drawing competition. More details later.
