PEACE, FORGIVENESS AND RECONCILIATION

As we enter once more on this time of remembrance, I wonder how many of you have heard of the Friends of Lochnagar? Nothing to do with a story written by the Prince of Wales about a mountain near Balmoral but everything to do with the Lochnagar Crater formed on the battlefield at the beginning of the Battle of the Somme by a large mine placed under the German front lines.



The largest crater created by man in anger, which resulted in the bloodiest day in British military history, was detonated at 7.28am on 1st July 1916, sending debris almost a mile into the air and leaving a crater 70ft (21m) deep and 330 ft (100 m) wide that we can still see today.

It might seem strange for a crater to have group of 'friends' but in 1978, when the Lochna-

gar Crater was in danger of being filled in, numerous veterans of the conflict from all sides with first-hand experiences of the Crater expressed their concern; many had visited the site to remember friends who had died there. Eventually the crater was purchased by Richard Dunning as a permanent memorial. He said, "Often I travelled with them (the veterans) to Lochnagar, to stand beside them as they told their stories, and despite it being over six decades before, they

would often quietly weep. It soon became clear that the Crater was far more than just an historic, archaeological or military site."

Over the years, Richard created the Lochnagar Crater Foundation, and the site has become a focus for fostering a special spirit of peace and reconciliation, where people can begin to understand the trauma of war and the fearsome power and destructive force of modern warfare.

Another positive outcome has been the Lochnagar Partnerships for Peace - an international movement to honour the dead and heal the living. It reflects the fact that those who die in war are ultimately striving for a peace which sadly seems unattainable, and argues that we need to do more than just hold commemorations on anniversaries but do something positive.

Although as individuals we may not be able to engineer peace between nations, we can make our own contribution by bringing more peace into our own lives and the lives of those around us.

Have you lived in Cromhall for more than 5 years and are over 65 years old? If so then you need to read on......

From Cromhall Allotment Charity......

"Why don't I get the Allotment vouchers at Christmas?" ... a question I'm sure a few Cromhall residents think or may be asked by a neighbour. The answer is simple - the charity is just not aware of you.

Another opinion often heard voiced on receipt of the gift is "that's very nice, but I don't need it, give it to someone else" or "I don't need charity" and refuse to accept it. Of course you can refuse it but have you thought about helping others, organizations or individuals, by using the vouchers and giving them the goods? (Please do not give your vouchers to someone else to use as they are issued in your name.)

To explain further.... the "Cromhall Poor's Allotment Charity" to give it it's full name (Reg. No. 204061) was set up in 1973 as an amalgamation of a few small charities and, like the previous charities, its purpose is to give "relief to the poor". This can be anyone in the parish of Cromhall, no matter what age, who is in need of assistance.

The limited income for the charity comes from rents received from land it owns and it is this annual income which funds the mandate.



Anyone could apply to the charity for assistance, perhaps a young apprentice having difficulty funding necessary tools, or families struggling to buy school uniforms for children. Applications like these, or any other situation of hardship, would always be considered.

But individual requests rarely occur and the trustees have, for some years now, resolved to distribute the income in the form of vouchers to be used in the village shop. The trustees annually agree the amount,

which could fluctuate up or down, and have agreed that this is to go to all who have lived in the village for 5 years or more, aged 65 or over (man or woman) and with one gift per household.

It is extremely difficult to know who is eligible or not for the gift, so if you feel you are missing out please do make yourself known.

With the current data protection regulations, your consent is required for the charity to have your name on the list it holds to administer general vouchers. The village shop has application/ consent forms, please ask for one at the counter and return the completed form to the shop or directly to me.

Lastly, if you are struggling and would like to make a specific request for help, please contact me or put your request in writing to the charity giving as much information as possible. The trustees will be happy to consider any request.



A new name in Owl & Bird of Prey Conservation lands in South Gloucestershire

A new conservation group has formed to conserve and protect wild owls and birds of prey in and around South Gloucestershire. The **South Glos Owl & Bird of Prey Conservation group** aims to bring local people together to help recreate natural hunting and breeding areas for owls and birds of

prey.

Paul Golledge, group spokesman, said: "Without the amazing work of conservationists, our magnificent owls and birds of prey would be under threat through the loss of essential hunting and breeding grounds. South Gloucestershire is a vibrant area for barn owls, tawny owls, little owls, peregrine falcons and kestrels, and this new group is committed to protecting them through field work but also by inspiring new conservationists through supporting educational activities across the district."

The group currently has a small number of experienced volunteers recreating natural habitat and building nest boxes. These boxes are built and installed in suitable areas across South Gloucestershire where breeding success is monitored and recorded.

The group can provide educational talks, owl prowl walks and other wildlife events, attending fetes and fairs to help share their knowledge and understanding of these magnificent birds to inspire people of all ages to help protect our native owls and birds of prey.

Formed in the summer of 2021, the group is appealing for more volunteers to join the team to help conserve and protect the owls and birds of prey of South Gloucestershire.

Mr Golledge said: "As a new group we are appealing to anyone across our communities who wants to get involved. No experience is necessary, just a passion to help wildlife succeed in your area."

Gloucestershire Historic Churches Trust had a hugely successful evening celebrating their 40th anniversary at Gloucester Cathedral and announced they have raised a marvellous £37,000 so far in their anniversary year.

Around 200 people attended a beautiful Choral Evensong, with music written by Gloucestershire composers, followed by a reception in the Chapter House, with Gloucestershire wine kindly donated by the Three Choirs Vineyards. Gloucestershire Lord Lieutenant & President of GHCT, Edward Gillespie OBE introduced the evening.

Chairman of the Trust Colin Senior reflected on the highlights of the last 40 years and updated attendees with the Trusts fundraising progress so far. The Trust is aiming to raise £1,000 for each of the years it has helped historic churches in its 40th anniversary year, enabling them to support many more projects over the coming years.

Keep yourself and others safe this autumn and winter

Colds, flu and other respiratory illnesses are more common in colder months as people are indoors more often, allowing viruses to pass more easily from one person to another. This will also mean the risk of Covid-19 infection is higher. These infections, as well as cold weather can make some health problems worse and even lead to serious complications, especially if you are 65 or older, or if you have a long-term health condition.

The Director of Public Health for South Gloucestershire, and the Leader of South Gloucestershire Council are therefore urging everyone in South Gloucestershire to take sensible and safe precautions to keep themselves and others safe.

Their advice is to:

- Come forward when invited for vaccination of both Covid and flu
- Cover your nose and mouth when you cough and sneeze
- Stay at home if you are unwell, to reduce the risk of passing any illnesses on to friends, family, colleagues, and others in your community
- Wash your hands with soap and water or use hand sanitiser regularly throughout the day
- Wear a face covering in enclosed and crowded spaces where you come into contact with people you don't normally meet or where it will make you and others feel more comfortable
- Try to meet outdoors or in well-ventilated indoor areas
- Self-isolate and get a PCR test if you have symptoms of Covid-19
- Self-isolate if you test positive for Covid-19 or are told to do so by NHS Test and Trace. This remains a legal requirement
- Take a regular rapid Covid-19 test twice a week if you don't have symptoms.
- Be kind, courteous and considerate of others – take into account not only your own risks, but also of those around you, such as those with clinical vulnerabilities.

Booster vaccine

People aged 50 years and over, care home residents, health and social care workers and younger people at risk (who have already had 2 doses of the Covid-19 vaccine) are being prioritised to receive a booster jab from 6 months after their second dose. This move will prolong the protection vaccines offer, particularly for those most vulnerable to Covid-19 as we head into the autumn and winter months.

The NHS will contact you when it is your turn to have a booster.

A number of items have been appearing on memorial stones, edging has appeared round some graves, plastic flowers etc — please would you help us by following our regulations.





The recent death of Eva Schulkins will sadden many, especially residents of Cromhall where her contribution to village life was so outstanding. Ann Greenhalgh shares her memories:

Eva and I lived at opposite ends of Cromhall village but our paths crossed regularly. Eva was a good friend who was willing to do anything that helped the community. 5Alive magazines are delivered to everyone in Cromhall each month and Eva willingly delivered to the Jubilee Lane

area for many years, helping to keep everyone informed about village affairs.



Eva was a regular member of St Andrew's congregation and a dedicated member of the choir for as long as I can remember. Her Christian faith was strong.

She was always willing to help with social events in church, homes or the Village Hall. The Tombola stall was her speciality at the Garden Fete each year, raising funds for the care and upkeep of St Andrew's Church and churchyard. Help and support for other church events was always offered and thankfully accepted.

John Canning Dove

One of those whose names are listed on Falfield's war memorial is John Canning Dove. The Dove family came to live in Falfield in the early 1840s when the Reverend William Dove came from Thornbury to take up the role of minister at the Congregational chapel at Mount Pleasant. The family continued to live there for the best part of a hundred years.

However, John Canning Dove, who was known as 'Jacky', was not born here but in Queensland, Australia in 1897. His grandfather, also named William, had emigrated there in the 1850s. Jacky

was educated in New Zealand at King's College in Auckland, eventually enrolling to study medicine. However, when World War I began he was eager to join up and in 1917 joined the 4th Battalion, New Zealand Rifle Brigade.

After training in New Zealand, he arrived in England in July 1918 and by September was on his way to France where on October 26th he died of wounds received when a shell exploded whilst he was putting his Lewis gun section in position in the village of Vertigneul, a few miles east of Cambrai during what became known as the Battle of the Sambre. He was twenty years old, and it was sixteen days before the Armistice.

The effect of his death on the family, both in the antipodes and in Falfield must

have been devastating and they ensured that he would not be forgotten in either location, so his name was added to the memorial at Falfield where his great-aunt, Susanna, was one of the village committee members involved in raising funds and arranging for a memorial to be set up.

Although Jacky had died at a field dressing station and been buried in a nearby farmyard, his body was later re-interred along with 25 other New Zealanders in the Vertigneul churchyard.

In the 1980s Jacky's nephew, with the help of a French war historian, went in search of his uncle's grave and unexpectedly met a local resident who had been 10 years old at the time of the battle and had the original grave-marker. Arrangements were made for it to be taken to New Zealand where it is now kept permanently.

The full story appears in an article in the autumn edition of 'Lochnagar Crater Today', the biannual journal produced for the Friends of Lochnagar, a charity whose volunteers maintain the iconic Crater at La Boisselle on the Somme battlefield. See www.lochnagarcrater.org
