Remember in November

Remember, remember, the fifth of November ... November is a month of remembrance and remembering with many notable dates and reminders from both the church and more generally.

November begins with the church festivals of All Saints and All Souls, 1st and 2nd of November. All Saints is the day when we remember with thanksgiving those men

and women many of whom have worked for justice, peace and the wellbeing of all. At All Souls we give thanks for those who have nurtured us through life and are no longer with us.

Next up is Bonfire Night which has a very complex history of religion, politics and nationalism, much of which is forgotten in the noise of the fireworks today. This is followed quickly by Armistice Day and Remembrance Sunday with its theme "Lest we forget." The following Sunday, is RoadPeace Day, a day of remembrance for road traffic victims; most of us will know a family who have lost a loved one in an accident on our roads.

But as well as remembering backward to the things of the past I believe that remembering should also have a forward focus, to remember the things that we should do.

So, at All Saints' tide perhaps we could recall those little things we could do to make the world a better place, to quote Edmund Burke "The only thing necessary for the triumph of evil is that good men do nothing". Little acts of goodness and kindness can make a difference in the lives of others.

At All Souls', we remember with thanksgiving those who have nurtured us and so we consider the legacy that we will leave for our children, grandchildren and our communities. What difference will we make in the lives of others, how do we nurture them?

On Bonfire Night maybe we should hold in our thoughts and prayers our politicians as they face many issues today, we think forward to the questions we may want to ask them in the election due next year.

As I write this on day 3 of the conflict around the Gaza Strip, I feel helpless but I can make a difference in the place where I am by seeking peace. So, as we approach Remembrance Sunday, we consider what we may be able to do to bring peace in our local community.

And for RoadPeace we should have a future focus keeping everyone safe on our roads, pedestrians, cyclists, drivers and riders, what we can do to make them safe places for others.

November is the month for remembering, remembering both backwards and forwards, recalling our history and making commitments to make small changes. A small change in our behaviour can have a huge impact.

It is the small changes that makes a difference; as St David of Wales reminds us, "Be joyful, keep the faith and do the little things".

Let's sing the 'GOOD NEWS' at St George Church, Falfield, on Sunday 24th December starting at 3.30pm

Yes, we know it's only November! This 5 Alive is bringing you the good news that St George's Church will be preparing for Christmas in a different way this December.



During our December services the Church is alight with the warm glow of lit candles placed in the windows of the Church. This, we hope, is a welcoming sign for you to come and join us for any of our services in December. We offer a quiet time to sit and reflect as well as sing in this busy time in the run up to Christmas Day.

There are two traditional services that are held as we come nearer to Christmas Day. These are the 'Carols by Candlelight' and the 'Christingle' service. This year we will be combining and celebrating both of these services on Christmas Eve staring at 3.30pm

The Christingle service is a delight as families come together to hear again the Christmas story, during which children, sometimes with the help of an adult, gradually build up the Crib scene which is placed at the front of the church.

The children also hear the meaning of the Christingle, often helping with the explanation as it is talked though. Then there is the wonderful experience of holding the Christingle orange with the lit candle (under the supervision of an adult) before blowing it out. The Christingle is then taken home, with as many sweets that are not eaten beforehand.

This year as Christmas Eve falls on Sunday 24th December, we are combining the much loved 'Christingle' Service and the 'Carols by Candlelight' in one service. The whole service will be very informal as we add the traditional carols which form the Christmas story as the children build up the crib scene.

If you have never experienced a 'Christingle' Service, or a 'Carols by Candlelight', please come along this year, there is no age limit to this wonderful expression of God's love demonstrated in the symbol of the Christingle and the singing of Carols.

Have you lived in Cromhall for more than 5 years and are over 65 years old? If so then you need to read on......

From Cromhall Allotment Charity...... "Why don't I get the Allotment vouchers at Christmas?" ... a question I'm sure a few Cromhall residents think or may be asked by a neighbour. The answer is simple - the charity is just not aware of you.

Another opinion often heard voiced on receipt of the gift is "that's very nice, but I don't need it, give it to someone else" or "I don't need charity" and refuse to accept it. Of course, you can refuse it but have you thought about helping others, organizations or individuals, by using the vouchers and giving them the goods? (Please do not give your vouchers to someone else to use as they are issued in your name.)

To explain further.... the "Cromhall Poors Allotment Charity" to give it its full name (Reg. No. 204061) was set up in 1973 as an amalgamation of a few small charities and, like the previous charities, its purpose is to give "relief to the poor". This can be anyone in the parish of Cromhall, no matter what age, who is in need of assistance. The limited income for the charity comes from rents received from land it owns and it is this annual income which funds the mandate.

Anyone could apply to the charity for assistance, perhaps a young apprentice having difficulty funding necessary tools, or families struggling to buy school uniforms for children. Applications like these, or any other situation of hardship, would always be considered.

But individual requests rarely occur and the trustees have, for some years now, resolved to distribute the income in the form of vouchers to be used in the village shop. The trustees annually agree the amount, which could fluctuate up or down, and have agreed that this is to go to all who have lived in the village for 5 years or more, aged 65 or over (man or woman) and with one gift per household. It is extremely difficult to know who is eligible or not for the gift, so if you feel you are missing out please do make yourself known. With the current data protection regulations, your consent is required for the charity to have your name on the list it holds to administer general vouchers. The village shop has application/consent forms, please ask for one at the counter and return the completed form to the shop or directly to me.

Lastly, if you are struggling and would like to make a specific request for help, please contact me or put your request in writing to the charity giving as much information as possible. The trustees will be happy to consider any request.

Falfield Parish Council

As the Village Hall was closed for refurbishment the Council's October meeting took place at HMP Eastwood Park Training Centre on Tuesday 17th October.

Charfield Ward Cllr John O'Neil reported to the meeting that a consultation on South Gloucestershire Council's budget for 2024/25 would be available shortly and informed Cllrs that one of the proposals in the consultation would be the introduction of car parking charges for all car parks under the control of the Authority. He also confirmed that the Recycling and Waste Collection services consultation was now live in which it was asking for comments on the proposal to increase the annual charge to £60 for the Green Bin service and moving Black Bin service to either a three or four-week collection. Councillors present felt that the proposal to introduce parking charges would deter people from shopping in Thornbury and hoped that if charges were to be introduced that the first one or two hours were free of charge.

Councillors approved a grant application from the Village Hall Management Committee for their Phase Two refurbishment programme which would include a new kitchen and the installation of a mezzanine floor in the small hall. The Clerk also provided the meeting with a report on the progress on Phase 1 which involved a complete re-wiring of the hall, installation of a disabled toilet and an audio system. Councillors also noted that the Village Hall had received a grant of £23,860 from the Queen's Platinum Jubilee fund which would be used to cover some of Phase One costs.

It was agreed that Councillor Hathway would represent the Parish Council at the Annual Remembrance Service which would take place at the War Memorial on Sunday 12th November.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Tuesday 21st November in the Village Hall which will include the setting of the Council's budget for 2024/25.

Tortworth Forest Centre is based in The Dell at Tortworth Arboretum. Once owned by the Ducie family, the wider arboretum is now split between hotel grounds, the Dell, Leyhill Prison and surrounding estate land. For a decade The Dell was abandoned leaving it overgrown and unsafe. Since 2014 volunteers have met regularly to work on restoration and maintenance. As part of the restoration work 59 new trees and shrubs have been planted and 72 trees re-labelled. We welcome new volunteers, and offer a safe space in which to work and be yourself.

On Wednesdays and Thursdays Tortworth is home to the Hawthorn (for people who identify as women) and Oak (for adults of both genders) nature based wellbeing projects. To date we have run over 270 wellbeing sessions, benefiting more than 100 people.

We'd love to see you in the woods! You're invited to join our events from relaxed visitor days where you can wander at your leisure, to more hands-on workshops such as wreath making, nettle cordage, bushcraft, foraging and more. You can also hire this stunning ancient woodland for weddings, 'almost wild camping', corporate retreats and other social gatherings and celebrations.
