If you are going into or in hospital... You can help to make sure that the church team can respond as you would like us to when you are ill.

It's important that if you are admitted to hospital, you do three things:-

- Make sure someone tells one of the ministry team that you are going into hospital – ask them to pass on the message as appropriate.
- Make it plain to the hospital staff whether (or not!) you would like a visit. This means that when someone rings up, they won't have to spend time saying 'hang on, 'I'll just ask him/her...'
- 3. Make it plain what sort of visit you would like: would you prefer a friend from the church or one of the visiting team or would you particularly like a clergy visit? If you want to be certain of a private, one to one chat, don't be afraid to ask the hospital staff if they will allow your minister to come outside normal visiting hours, so that they don't take up precious time and space from your family.

Falfield Parish Council Report

Cllr Stanley gave a report of her attendance at the AGM of 1st St George's Scout Group which took place on 15th September. Also on the same date both Cllr Stanley and Cllr Salt were invited to a seminar at Stone village hall in relation to their newly installed automated external defibrillator (AED) which had been recently purchased through money received from Stone Parish Council and public donations. This is something which Falfield Parish Council has previously considered as a possible asset to the Village and it was agreed that this would be discussed in more detail again at their October meeting.

The new notice board which HMP Leyhill Prison Workshops have made, is now ready and is expected to be installed during October to replace the current notice board which is no longer fit for purpose.

In a written report from the Community Liaison Officer at HMP Eastwood Park it was confirmed that the Salvation Army have now installed a clothing bin adjacent to the Visitors Centre Portakabin which was available for the community to use if they wished to recycle any old clothing.

The general feedback regarding the concrete planters being brought back into service had been positive and Councillors agreed that the planting of these containers should continue. Both The Gables Hotel and HMP Eastwood Park have agreed to continue to undertake their maintenance for the next twelve months.

The Clerk reported that the Parish Council Centenary seat on Cutts Heath Road had now been refurbished. Councillors also approved work on four wooden seats in the area of the Village Green and War Memorial as well as maintenance work and repainting of the Village Green Gates.

Councillors also agreed to purchase a quantity of daffodil bulbs for planning on the Village Green. The 1st Falfield and Stone Brownies, with assistance of members of the Council, have offered to undertake the planting of these bulbs during October.

Draft minutes of the September meeting will be available to view on the Council website no later than 9th October.

Life at The Huts in Tytherington (2)

Before my call-up other things happened.

I can remember a large team of workers kept busy filling sandbags at Tytherington quarry from a large mound of sand within sight of The Huts. This was known locally as 'The Sand Heap'. I used to chat with the men and was able to get a ride on a lorry delivering bags to the BAC Shadow Factory* at Patchway. My mother was very busy at the time supplying the workers at the quarry with water, tea and cakes delivered by Fred Smith with horse and cart.

From The Huts in September 1940 I saw the wo daylight raids on Filton Airfield. The one on 25th September had only anti-aircraft fire to contend with but the second on 27th September was a different matter. Hurricanes of 504 Squadron scattered the bombers. Unfortunately, we learned later that an air-raid shelter had been hit causing casualties^{**}. I also saw the first night air-raid on Bristol on 2nd November 1940.

My parents were concerned about my education and so for many nights they took our family down to a concrete building at the quarry which was used as a canteen during the day. We managed to get a reasonable night's sleep, which was very important for me because I was in my third year at the Grammar School.



The first V-1 was launched at London on 13 June 1944. At the peak more than one hundred V-1s a day were fired at south-east England until October 1944 when the last V-1 site in range of Britain was overrun by Allied forces

Call-up day eventually arrived. It so happened that Emily Brock, mother of Reg and Cyril (Cyril eventually married my sister, Jean) was travelling to Paddington that day to visit her sister. It meant a very early start and so Reg picked me up and we departed for Bristol Temple Meads.

We arrived at Paddington and I wished her a safe visit because 'Doodlebugs' (V-1 flying bombs) were coming over. I went across London by the underground to the LNER station en route to HMS Royal Arthur at Skegness, Lincolnshire.

*(British shadow factories were the outcome of the Shadow Scheme, a plan devised in 1935 and developed by the British Government in the build-up to World War II to try to meet the urgent need for more aircraft using technology

transfer from the motor industry to implement additional manufacturing capacity. The term 'shadow' was not intended to mean secrecy, but rather the protected environment they would receive by being staffed by all levels of skilled motor industry people alongside (in the shadow of) their own similar motor industry operations.)

** 92 company employees lost their lives in an air raid shelter during an air raid on 25th September 1940 at Bristol Aeroplane Company Filton.
