Celebrate your birthday with a party in church!!

When did you think of seriously giving thanks for your own, or a loved one? Maybe a fleeting thought as you send a birthday message or raise a glass at a party. No, I mean actually prepare a service, come to church, (not on a Sunday) and dress to the nines to celebrate with family and friends.

St. Leonard's church recently hosted just such an event. A large Nigerian family and many friends assembled from Lagos, the USA and from around the UK. The church was packed with



folk who just lived their faith with open joy, celebrating the 70th birthday of a much-respected architect working in Nigeria and the UK. In Nigerian culture it is essential to give thanks to the Lord before going on to have a whale of a party. Fen and I had the privilege of being part of this celebration.

The service, conducted by a priest from the family's church in London and one who came specially from Lagos, loosely followed our usual Holy Communion, with a somewhat rambling sermon, lengthy prayers and much natural heartfelt vocal participation by the congregation.


Sharing communion also had a party atmosphere. As

Christine came to the end of the lustily sung six hymns, a keyboard player took over with current pop songs. Organising over a hundred people to take communion is not easy but herding cats may have been easier. However, I couldn't help being swept up in the experience, when we became the last communicants, joining everyone singing and dancing back to our seats.

The fashions, all incredibly special and beautiful, were fascinating. Apparently each family has a special-coloured woven fabric which only the immediate family are entitled to wear, very much like Scottish tartans, but not confined to a kilt. In this case shades of navy, white and maroon

were worn by the ladies as long dresses of different designs but all chose the same style of headgear, although on other occasions some styles of headgear are far more elaborate. Surprisingly, there are no pins or fixings, just very clever folding and tucking. The men and boys wore robes of the same fabric and everyone else tended to wear matching colours or pure white, although a few ladies had embroidered beaded dresses that would not have been out of place in Hollywood! And the shoes!! A professional photographer roamed throughout capturing the whole event!

We laugh about 'Tortworth time' when the service doesn't start on time, but this beat even our tardiness, starting forty-five minutes



Tortworth has never seen the like, nor will again I guess. It was a delight to have been there and been able to offer our church which was greatly appreciated and the building much admired. 


I would like to congratulate the Cromhall Flower Show committee on putting on the recent Show. Thank you especially to James Imrie for arranging meetings and acting as treasurer.





Falfield Parish Council

After the summer break where there was no meeting in August, Councillors met on Monday 16th September. During public participation a number of issues were raised which included overgrown hedges encroaching on the pavement; and an uneven section of A38 resulting in noise from passing traffic, especially empty quarry vehicles. Also, a parishioner commented on the new electricity poles which have been erected on the corner of the Cotswold Homes development asking whether their overall height could be reduced. Cllrs agreed to make the Planning Officer dealing with this development aware.

There was a larger than normal number of planning applications to consider, including two applications for HMP Eastwood Park which the Council had previously commented on but had been made aware that revised drainage plans had been submitted. Cllrs agreed to respond requesting that, as the stream adjacent to the site was within a flood zone, a survey should be undertaken to establish that it could take additional surface and storm water from the sites. Also, it was noted that one drawing had been amended showing less density of Landscape Trees/Woodland on the boundary with the dwellings at Eastley Close and Church Avenue than had been shown on the original plans.

Cllrs also agreed to make comments on the National Highways - Charfield Developments Full Mitigation Scheme Assessment for Junction 14 of the M5 in relation to the two proposed largescale housing developments in Charfield and their potential effect on this junction. Cllrs were concerned that the proposals set out within the scheme were not adequate to meet the future needs of this junction.

A grant application had been received from the newly formed Falfield Baby and Toddler Group. This was discussed and Cllrs agreed to award £1,500.00 from the Council's Community Infrastructure Levy Income. This would be used to cover the Group's initial set-up costs and on-going rent and insurance.

A written report had been received from the Chair of the Village Hall Management Committee which confirmed that remodelling of the small hall to create a mezzanine floor with larger and updated meeting facilities was due to start on 2nd October.

A number of highways issues were raised along with concerns that previous issues raised with StreetCare were not being acted upon and closed out in a timely manner.

The next meeting of the Council will take place in the Village Hall on **Monday 21st October** at **7.30pm.**

Rockhampton Parish Council

The quarterly meeting of the Parish Council held on 19th August was attended by all five Councillors and Ward Councillor Tony Williams with Ward Councillor Matthew Riddle giving his apologies.

In his report Ward Cllr Williams indicated that car parking charges for all car parks in the ownership of South Gloucestershire Council were expected to be rolled out from early 2025 onwards. Further information would be available within the coming weeks. There would be an element of free parking, but final details were not known at the present time.

Under highways the issue of uncut grass verges in certain parts of the village being a potential safety hazard was discussed. Information received prior to the meeting from Ward Cllr Riddle indicated that they were due to be cut before the end of August. It was noted that further speed monitoring would take place in the coming weeks.

Cllr Phillips provided information on the planned Village Maintenance Group. Cllr Cullimore commented that although the Council's insurance policy included cover for volunteers, he requested that the Council's insurers were contacted, and written confirmation requested of its limitations. Cllr England also suggested that the cover for volunteers set at £100,000 could be increased and requested the Clerk to enquire from the Insurers what the additional cost to the Council would be. Until this information was available the Council were not in a position to agree to cover this working party.

It was agreed that the Autumn Litter pick would take place on 26th October between 11am and 1pm (see poster on page 19 for more information).

The next meeting of the Parish Council will take place on **Monday 11**th **November** in the Village Hall commencing at 7.30pm.

TLM Training Nurses in India

In September The Leprosy Mission opened its first nursing college in Salur, India; a country that is home to over more than half of the world's leprosy cases.

TLM runs 14 hospitals in India, all of which need specialist nurses. 60 students started their training in September and a new intake of 60 will be admitted each



year until the capacity of 240 is reached. Priority places are given, free of charge, to young people affected by leprosy who will have a better understanding of the problems encountered by their patients.

No doubt the youngsters joining the course will be excited about training to be a nurse, but also nervous about leaving their families too - especially if they had a key role as a carer or were needed to help bring in vital income. However, these youngsters are building futures and breaking the cycle of poverty for the next generation, which will ultimately benefit more families living with the effects of leprosy.

The Armstrong Hall reopening project September 2024 update

There is a great deal going on towards the reopening of the Armstrong Hall, but it is just too early to tell when the venue will be ready to open to the public. It's a truly exciting and challenging project, and evidence indicates that this area, with its very many active, able and caring residents, can sustain it and benefit from it for the long term.

What's happening?

Legalities Thornbury Community and Arts (TCA) is a Community Interest Company (CIC) set up in 2022 to benefit the community, though it doesn't have full charity status and thus lacks tax relief benefits. It can negotiate leases and operate like a business, with profit restrictions.

The Armstrong Hall Charitable Trust (AHT) owns the Armstrong Hall Complex (AHC) and is managed by the Town Council. Five Councillors and three TCA representatives meet monthly to modernize and operate the facility. Once AHT is satisfied with TCA's compliance with safety and legal requirements, a lease will be drawn up, making AHT the landlord and TCA the tenant, allowing reopening works to begin. TCA plans to convert to a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) upon reopening, qualifying for tax relief and better funding opportunities.

Project team TCA, as a CIC, has established a Project Board (PB) of three people to manage the four-year plan. The project involves reopening the AHC, establishing the business, and monitoring it for three years to achieve sustainability and restore community facilities. The PB is forming small teams and developing strategies to be ready for action.

Operating the business All aspects of operations are currently being planned. The size and layout of the venue provide excellent scope for activities to meet the needs and interests of all residents. We will be creating a business plan to test potential. In addition, a marketing team will engage with the community to identify new interests, as well as promote usage in the long run. Establishing communication channels with local entities (businesses, charities, community centres, schools, churches) will also be key.

The building The Complex has been desolate since March 2020 when the staff left. Essential roof repairs have been made, but more work is needed. Brambles have overgrown the stage door, and the parquet flooring in the main hall has lifted. Safety developments are essential before reopening. The dressing rooms may need demolition, and the building requires fresh paintwork. A building surveyor's proposal is awaited to determine the scope of work needed. Once surveys and costings are complete, the Project Board will plan upgrades for long-term sustainability. A local company with expertise and an excellent knowledge of the whole fabric of the AHC is preparing a proposal for a technical theatre service.
