Give thanks and help

How fortunate we are to live in this beautiful part of the British Isles, in small village communities surrounded by farmland and countryside. The countryside has not looked at its best this year.



Autumn came early with the lack of rain in the summer and the intense heatwaves in August. The early blackberries dried up in the hedgerows, trees lost many of their leaves, fields and roadside verges turned yellow and both flowers and vegetables in our gardens suffered. Farmers have suffered too with the lack of the usual green pastures for their cows and sheep. Arable crops have ei-

ther failed to grow or will be poorer in quality when harvested.

However, harvest festivals will still take place. They are a celebration of the food grown on the land and, in Britain, we have given thanks for successful harvests since pagan times.

Centuries ago, Harvest used to be celebrated at the beginning of the harvest season when communities would appoint a strong and respected man of the village as their 'Lord of the harvest'. He

would be responsible for negotiating the harvest wages and organising the fieldworkers.

Harvest festivals were then held on August 1st which was called Lammas, meaning 'loaf mass'. Farmers made loaves of bread from their new wheat crop and gave them to their local church. These were then used as the communion bread during a special service thanking God for the harvest.



The end of harvest was celebrated with a big meal called a 'harvest supper' which was often held on Michaelmas Day at the end of September. The 'Lord of

the Harvest' sat at the head of the table. A goose stuffed with apples was eaten along with a variety of vegetables.

Harvest festivals in churches and schools remind Christians of all the good things God gives them. It makes them want to share with others who are not so fortunate. Traditionally churches



were filled with locally produced flowers, fruit, and vegetables but, these days, gifts of tinned and dried foods are often brought and following the service these are taken to local foodbanks to be shared with families in need. This year, with the rise in the cost of living, they will be needed more than ever.

Falfield Parish Council Report

Council meetings

Due to the mourning period for Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II the meeting scheduled for Tuesday 20th September was postponed until Monday 26th September. The October meeting will take place on Tuesday 18th October.

Falfield Grange Development Community Liaison Group

Unfortunately, the regular Liaison meetings between the Parish Council, nominated residents and Linden Homes have not taken place since December 2021 following the departure of the then Site Manager. Although several requests have been made to Linden Homes for these meetings to re-commence, to date no further meetings have taken place and as the development is expected to be completed by the end of 2023 it is unlikely that further meetings will take place.

Park & Share off Moorslade Lane – update

During the course of 2022 the Parish Council have requested updates on the future of the Park & Share off Moorslade Lane. The Parish Council now understands that discussions have taken place between Linden Homes and South Gloucestershire Council with a view to South Gloucestershire Council taking over the site without any maintenance contribution from the developer, which had been part of the original 106 agreement. However, Linden Homes have now indicated that it is exploring other options for the site and it is likely that it would be sold off to a third party. This is of concern to the Parish Council as the original intention was that parking would be free rather than a pay and display car park.

Village Green

The Council have agreed to install a permanent power supply on the Village Green. The laying of the necessary cabling on the Green by the Council's electrical contractor along with Western Power Distribution bringing power onto the Green has now been completed. Unfortunately, at the current time the Parish Council have been unable to source an electricity provider, but hope this will be resolved before the Carols around the Christmas Tree which is due to take place on Saturday 10th December.

Finally, work on replacing the wooden fence between the Village Green and the Huntsman Car Park was expected to have been completed by the end of September.

Rockhampton Parish Council

The last meeting of the Council took place on Monday 22nd August with all Councillors in attendance along with Ward Councillor Mat-thew Riddle.

Councillors were informed by the Clerk that the Council had received a Members Ward Funding grant of £1,000 which Councillors agreed should be used towards the installation of "Village Gates" at the entrance to the Village on the Lower Stone Road. However, before any work could proceed Ward Councillor Riddle indicated that a ground survey would have to be undertaken by South Gloucestershire Council followed by the Parish Council applying to South Gloucestershire Council for a licence.

Councillor Goode informed the meeting that



he had received the Queen's Platinum Jubilee commemoration wooden bench which would be placed on the Common in due course.

Councillors discussed several highways issues, which included:-

- The missing 30 mph repeater signs between the Gloucester Road and Newton Hill, which were due to be replaced in the coming weeks.
- The continued worsening of the Hill Road due to the ongoing subsidence as a result of the recent dry spell and noted that Ward Cllr Riddle had arranged a site meeting with the Asset Management Team at StreetCare to see what could be done.
- The speed visor had been programmed to be positioned on the Lower Stone Road from 24th August 2022 for approx. one week.

The next quarterly meeting will be held on Monday 21st November at 7.30 in the Village Hall.
