SUNFLOWER CUP - Classes 34-35 (awarded for longest sunflower, class 35)

- 34. Largest sunflower head (greatest measurement across the disk surface)
- 35. Longest sunflower (true length laid flat measured from ground level to underside of head and must be exhibited laid flat with roots removed at ground level).

RECIPE

VICTORIA SANDWICH

3 egg recipe sandwiches with raspberry jam and sprinkled with caster sugar.

TART

A sweet or savoury dish with shallow sides, bottom crust and a filling.

Pastry must be homemade

Jams must be exhibited in plain clear glass jars and covered with a wax disc and a cling film top or a screw top lid without a wax disc.

PIE

A sweet or savoury dish with deep sides, top crust, optional bottom crust and a filling.

MECRAFTS – CRAFTERS CUP (NEW)

48. Article of clothing, knitted or sewn

49. Any other handicraft, state if kit

50. Decorative item made from upcycled materials

51. Patchwork or quilting

Cakes and savouries must be exhibited in clear plastic bags, loosely tied.

Cling film must not be used due to the difficulty of removal and risk of damage to the exhibit.

Cakes and savouries requiring cutting must not be exhibited on doilies.

QUICK START GUIDE TO ENTRY

We have taken the opportunity of giving the show a revamp with the overall aim of making it easier for you to enter and easier for us to administer. Things have changed a little since the last show in 2019, so please take a few moments to read this quick start guide and the new rules before entering.

No need to enter in advance of show day anymore! Just turn up with your 'exhibits' and your 'exhibit tickets'.

- Prior to arrival on the morning of the show, complete an 'Exhibit Ticket' for each of your entries with the class number, your full name and your contact number completed and clearly legible (block capitals please).
- Exhibit Tickets can be found in the middle of the schedule, collected from the Village Shop or downloaded from Cromhall.com for printing at home.
- On the morning of the show, proceed to the show tent in St Andrew's School field and stage your exhibit in the space allocated for each class from 8:00am to 10:30am.
- Fold each of your Exhibit Tickets in half along the dotted line and place under or on each exhibit with the class number facing up and your name facing down so that it is not visible.
- Entry is free but there's a suggested donation of £1 per exhibitor via an honesty box located at the tent entrance.

RULES

1. Exhibits may be staged from 08:00 until 10.30am on show day. The show tent must be vacated by 10.30am. Judging starts promptly at 10.45am. THESE TIMES WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.
2. Exhibitors may not enter more than one exhibit in any one class.
3. Exhibits must be grown or worked solely by individual exhibitors except Floral Art, where flowers may be grown by a third party.
4. Children's exhibits must be grown or worked solely by individual children except for reasonable assistance which may be provided by a supervising adult appropriate to the age of the child.
5. Exhibitors must not enter any classes in which they are regarded as a professional. Professional in this instance is defined as a person who is engaged in the activity as their main paid occupation as opposed to an amateur.
6. Sunflowers must be exhibited laid flat with roots removed at ground level.
7. Handicrafts must have been made in the 12 months immediately preceding the show.
8. Pastry must be homemade.
9. Cakes and savouries must be exhibited in clear plastic bags, loosely tied. Cling film must not be used due to the difficulty of removal, risk of damage to the exhibit and excessive time required to unwrap during judging.
10. Cakes and savouries requiring cutting must not be exhibited on doilies.
11. Jams must be exhibited in plain clear glass jars and covered with a wax disc and a cling film top or a screw top lid without a wax disc.
12. Chutneys and pickles must be exhibited in plain clear glass jars with screw top lids.
13. Judges will award 1st, 2nd and 3rd place certificates in each individual class and 1st, 2nd and 3rd place rosettes for the best exhibits in each overall class.
14. In the event there are less than 3 entries in a category, the Judges reserve the right to award certificates according to merit based on their experience.
15. Judge's decisions on class results are final.
16. Exhibits, certificates and rosettes must not be removed from the show tent before 4.15pm without the prior consent of the Committee.
17. Prize money for overall class winners and runners up will be available for collection from the Treasurer located in the Admin Tent from 2pm. Prize money, certificates and rosettes not collected on show day will be taken to Cromhall Village Shop and will be available for collection until the end of September. After this date, unclaimed prize money will be donated to show funds.
18. Cups will typically be presented to overall class winners at 4pm.
19. If exhibitors wish to donate their exhibit(s) to the Auction, they should move their exhibit(s) to the Auction table at 4.15pm, after the cups presentation.
20. Cups will be engraved with the winner's name and will be presented at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) which is usually held in October. In the event that a winner is unable to attend the AGM, winners may arrange to collect their cup(s) by contacting a member of the Committee.
21. Cups must be returned to the Cromhall Village Shop at least 2 weeks prior to the Show. The shop may be contacted on 01454 299262. Opening times are Monday to Friday, 8.30am to 1pm and 2pm - 5pm, and Saturday, 8.30am to 11.30am.
22. The Committee are not responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits or personal property.

JUDGING & PRIZE MONEY

- Judges will award a 1st, 2nd and 3rd place certificate in each individual class.
- Judges will also award a 1st, 2nd and 3rd place rosette to the best exhibits in each overall class, e.g. Vegetable and Fruit. Overall class winners and runners-up will be awarded the following prize money:

Adults: 1st £15, 2nd £10, 3rd £5.
Children: 1st £10, 2nd £5, 3rd £2.
