TEMPORARY ROADWORKS FOR HIGHWAY DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS – B4058, BAGSTONE

I am writing to inform you of forthcoming roadworks on B4058, Bagstone whilst South Gloucestershire Council carries out essential repair and improvement works to the existing highway drainage systems.

To ensure we can carry out these works, and for the safety of both the public and our workers, B4058, Bagstone will be subject to temporary two-way traffic lights and partial road closures throughout the works programme.

The works are scheduled to begin at:

10am on 4th March 2019

It is anticipated that this scheme will take 10 months to complete.

It is intended that the majority of drainage improvement works will be carried out under temporary traffic signal control. However, due to the nature of some of the work being undertaken we may need to close the road for limited periods. Access for residents and businesses will be maintained during any closure period and a signed diversion route will be in place.

Please see the attached map for the location of the proposed works.

Background Information

The council was recently awarded a £3.35million grant to improve flood resilience of its highway network. B4058, Bagstone was selected as one of nine sites across South Gloucestershire for drainage improvement works and flood protection systems.

As you will be aware, this road suffers from flooding on a regular basis causing traffic disruption, damage to properties and to the highway. We have carried out comprehensive survey work which shows there are numerous defects with the existing drainage system.

Repairs will include replacing and/or upgrading defective pipes, removing root ingress from trees and replacing defective manholes and gully covers.

The impact on local communities

We realise these works will have a significant impact on the local community and road users. In order to discuss the project in more detail and provide you with the opportunity to ask the team any questions, we are holding a drop-in event on:




We do understand these works are inconvenient and we apologise for the disruption caused.
