The highlight of 2023 was the visit to Zambia in May. It had been five years since our last visit due to the Covid pandemic.

Our first meeting with the teachers was at the Sunday morning service at St Anne's Church. This was the first time we had been inside the new, large church and found it still required a lot of work to be done! However, the service was full of praise and joy with several choirs and a band.





Most of our time in Lusaka was spent in St Anne's and St Mark's schools with teachers and pupils, where everyone was excited to see us. We enjoyed getting to know the children and, with varying degrees of success, read stories to the younger children, planted seeds of various kinds with grades 6&7 and encouraged the older children to write letters to children at St Andrew's Primary School in Cromhall. The size of the classes made it more difficult than we had envisaged!



These are pre-school, reception and grade 1 pupils at St Mark's and St Anne's listening to a story of "The mouse that roared". They enjoyed roaring!



This is a classroom at St Mark's where grades 6 & 7 are taught. It is one of the two good sized classrooms built in 2016. Sadly, the rear is filled with old play equipment and broken desks. We advised them to either sell or dispose of the play equipment as there is no longer much outdoor space to make use of them. We requested a quote for the repair of the broken desks but have not yet received this.

These are Grade 5 pupils at St Anne's. The children all enjoyed drawing pictures of life in Zambia for us to bring back with us. We took boxes of coloured pencils and crayons to help with this and the children were delighted!





On Friday, a 'sports afternoon' was held. The area, once used for netball and football, is now destined to be a new, large church. The walls are under construction, but the children played around them and the builders!

There is a shortage of toilets at the school, one flush toilet and one pit latrine between 250 pupils and staff. The building at the back of this picture is the old

pit latrine belonging to the church but has also been used by the school. This is now unsafe to use.

During 2023 CLinC has helped by ensuring that all teachers, carers and guard receive at least a small payment each month. The average pay for a teacher was around K1.000 (£40) per month. This was topped up from the parental contributions.

All teachers were sent funds to obtain their teachers' licenses which are now, required by law.



CLinC also sent money to provide two hot, nutritious meals each week for all 550 children.

Over the year, we sent funds to empty the cesspit at St Anne's and fit new toilet pans to make the latrines more hygienic and suitable for the young children.

The photocopiers at both schools were serviced.

In the third term of 2023, we sent small donations to both schools to help pay the teachers

There are many other projects for next year, but we are waiting for approval and quotes.

Grade 8 & 9 pupils

For many years CLinC has been helping these pupils with the payment of school fees and a contribution towards uniforms. However, school fees are now paid by the government.

During our visit we realised just how well off our schools are compared with the majority of community schools.

This made us wonder if some of our money could be better spent to provide an education for more of these underpriviledged children.

St Matthias community school.

Like St Anne's and St Mark's, this is also a church school, held in St Matthias Anglican Church. All lessons take place in the main church building using rearranged pews to create classrooms. We were dismayed at the difficulties faced by the teachers including a lack of text books, writing materials and chalk. Like all community schools, there is no support from the government and the only money received is the parental contributions. As a result, the



teachers frequently go without pay for many months of the year.



Modern City School.

This school is run by Langson Zuze who, until a few years ago, taught at St Anne's. Impressed with what was being done for local children there, he decided to start a school to cater for other poor children a couple of miles away. We were very impressed with the way he was running the school and feel we would like to help him in a small way if funds allow.
