## Flexible Transport in your Community

In October this year, when we were handed the keys to a new Renault Trafic mini-bus. This new bus is part funded by the European Agriculture Fund for Rural Development.

The plan is for it to be used on a new bus service called the Rural to City Link (R2C). This will run in various rurally isolated areas such as Charfield, Cromhall, Falfield, Hill, Oldbury On Severn, Rockhampton, Tortworth and Tytherington. The whole idea behind the service is to support members of the community gain easy access in and out of the City. Enabling people to attend their medical appointments, social events and shopping trips further afield.

We will be visiting many of the local villages in the above areas with the opportunity of meeting many of you in the local community and given you all the chance to hop aboard and take a look at the new bus we have named WONKY, before Christmas and a planned launch in early 2020.

We look forward to meeting many of you soon. Further information on this new Rural to City Link will be advertised on our website soon as well as you being able to visit your local Parish and Town Council for further information.
